2016-80.tif AN ORDINANCE APPROVING SETTLEMENT OF PENDING LITIGATION BETWEEN THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE, JOHN KEANE, AND THE JACKSONVILLE POLICE AND FIRE PENSION BOARD OF TRUSTEES WITH RESPECT TO THE SENIOR STAFF VOLUNTARY RETIREMENT PLAN; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE A SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT AND AUTHORIZING THE OFFICE OF GENERAL COUNSEL TO TAKE ALL FURTHER ACTIONS TO SETTLE AND CONCLUDE THE LAWSUIT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, in 1990 the Legislature enacted Chapter 90-442, Laws of Florida, creating the Jacksonville Police and Fire Pension Fund Board of Trustees (the "Board of Trustees") to administer the retirement plan for the City of Jacksonville ("City") law enforcement officers and firefighters known as the Jacksonville Police and Fire Pension Fund ("Pension Fund"); and

WHEREAS, Chapter 90-442 also amended Section 18.07 of the Charter of the City of Jacksonville to include the Board of Trustees as an independent agency of the City; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees is granted those powers needed to administer the Pension Fund, including the power to "[e]mploy and fix the compensation of an administrator and any consultants, attorneys, actuaries, accountants, and other employees or contractors;" and

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WHEREAS, in 2000 the Board of Trustees created a defined

benefit plan for certain Board of Trustees employees, known as the
 Jacksonville Police and Fire Pension Fund Senior Staff Voluntary
 Retirement Plan ("Senior Plan"); and

WHEREAS, the City's auditors discovered the Senior Plan
during a 2012 audit of the Pension Fund, and on August 10, 2012,
the General Counsel for the City issued a legal opinion that the
Board of Trustees did not have the authority to create the Senior
Plan; and

9 WHEREAS, an ongoing dispute has arisen between the City and 10 the Board of Trustees as to the lawfulness of the Senior Plan, 11 resulting in the City filing a lawsuit against the Board of 12 Trustees and John Keane seeking declaratory judgment; and

WHEREAS, the Council believes that it is in the City's best interest to resolve the dispute without protracted and costly litigation; and

16 WHEREAS, the City agrees to settle the dispute as provided in 17 the Settlement Agreement (attached hereto as Exhibit 1); now 18 therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

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20 Section 1. Approval of Settlement Agreement and Authorization to Execute and Implement. There is hereby approved, 21 and the Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are 22 23 hereby authorized to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the 24 City, the Settlement Agreement in the form attached as Exhibit 1, 25 and the Office of General Counsel is hereby authorized to take, or cause to be taken, for and on behalf of the City, such further 26 27 action and execute all other documents to conclude the settlement and pending litigation. 28

29 Section 2. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become 30 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 31 without the Mayor's signature.
