- 1. Call to Order/Verify Quorum: Chair Shirley Lowry called the meeting to order at 6:45 p.m. Michelle Godwin verified a quorum.
- 2. Approval of the Previous Meeting Summary: Don Ingram moved that November's summary be approved. Tom Martin seconded the motion. CPAC approved.
- Jacksonville Sheriff's Office (JSO) Lt. Jessie York gave a 30 day crime report. Lt. York reported that the crime numbers are down and that there have been no homicides in the last 30 days. Lt. York announced that one abduction, one home invasion, nine robberies to individuals, and four robberies to businesses have occurred. Lt. York announced that burglaries to businesses are up and at 15. New officers are graduating from the academy and there is a regular flow of officers being placed on the streets. Lt. York asked CPAC members to report suspicious activity. Lt. - Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department (JFRD) Chief Donald Powell announced that it is usually very busy this time of the year, with an increase in cooking and space heater fires. Chief Powell reminded everyone to keep flammables, such as blankets and curtains, away from space heaters. 3. Elected Officials' Reports:

• City Council Member, District 12, Randy White, introduced himself to CPAC members and was available for questions.

• Kevin Kuzel, Executive Council Assistant to Council Member Jim Love, District 14, announced that Council Member Love chairs the Short Term Rental Committee and the committee is waiting on a draft resolution regarding short term rentals or Air B&B's. Mr. Kuzel stated that if the bill passes, the

requirements to operate an Air B&B will be stricter for residential areas in Jacksonville, including a requirement that an owner be on the property during the time of the rental. Mr. Kuzel also announced that the USS Wichita has been commissioned to Mayport. Ms. Gremer asked if a bill number has been assigned to the Air B&B issue. Mr. Kuzel said that an ordinance number has not been assigned. Jason Teal of the General Counsel's Office is drafting a bill.

4. Presentations: Dr. Diana Greene, Superintendent of Duval County Public Schools (DCPS) reported that DCPS is the second largest employer in Duval County and services 188 schools, including charter schools. These schools serve 130,223 students, and 14,000 employees. In 2017-2018 \$122 million in scholarships were given to DCPS students. Dr. Greene also announced that every high school has career academies. There are 110 career tech (CTE) high school programs in the DCPS. Dr. Greene announced that this school year, Duval County School board members will be prioritizing several areas: becoming an "A" district, safety and security of schools and financial solvency-increasing the districts fund balance. Dr. Greene announced that DCPS has received a grant that has been used to supply 115 cameras in every high school, two walk through metal detectors and 12 hand held metal detectors. The cameras should be installed by February. District middle schools will have 55 cameras installed. Dr. Greene also announced that by the end of the school year, every school will have a visitor's management system that will scan a visitor's information, checking for felonies and checking if the visitor is on the sexual offenders and predators list. Dr. Greene announced that for every school that has 2,000 students, there will be two school safety officers placed at that school. Dr. Greene also announced that the school board is creating a financial dashboard, which will be available to citizens to view in real time, how money is being spent. The financial dashboard is being created in order to provide financial transparency. Dr. Greene advised that UNF will be partnering with DCPS, in its early college program. Students will need a higher grade point average in order to participate in the proaram.

• Municipal Code Compliance Division (MCCD) – Jennifer Kohn, Zone 4 Senior Code Compliance Officer, announced that 1,654 inspections were completed in Zone 4 between December 2018 and January 14, 2019. These included 288 junk vehicle inspections, 661 nuisance inspections, 313 residential inspections and 39 unsafe structures. She said 1,332 total cases were completed. The Municipal Code Compliance Division completed 9,644 inspections throughout Jacksonville.

Parks, Recreation and Community Services (Parks) – Keith Meyerl, Division Chief of Recreation and Community Programming, announced that the department will be submitting two grant applications. One grant is for the amount of \$800,000, and will be used for the development of a new trail head at the Yellow Water Road Trail, and for two bridges that will connect the Jacksonville Baldwin Trail and Jennings State Forest. He said \$400,000 will come from the grant funds and the remainding \$400,000 will come from the department's Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) fund. The second grant is in the amount of \$800,000 and will be used for a paved multi-use trail at Cecil Field. Additional trails on the north side and south side of Normandy Boulevard will be added. He said \$400,000 will come from the grant funds and the remaining \$400,000 will come from the department's Capital Improvement's Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) fund. Mr. Meyerl announced that the Memorial Park bulk head repairs are ongoing and the balustrades are in the design phase. Mr. Meyerl announced that Jeb Stuart School Park concession stand is being renovated. Wesconnett Park's, Wesconnett Wild Cats won the Pop Warner National Championship. Mr. Meyerl announced that the Parks Department is recruiting for all your summer jobs. You must be 15 years or older to apply for the various positions. Stinson Park repairs are ongoing and should be done by the end of April.

- North Florida TPO received an introductory presentation on Transit Asset Management Plans by Denise Bunnewith, of the TPO staff, followed by a graphical presentation by Matthew Wilson from JTA. These plans are part of the federal requirement in the Moving Ahead for Progress in the Twenty First Century, and fixing America's Surface Transportation objectives.
- North Florida TPO approved a resolution endorsing Transit Asset Management Plans. Included are the plans for FDOT, UTA and St. Johns County. Clay and Nassau counties are grouped and included with the FDOT plans.
- North Florida TPO approved the JTA request to amend the FY 2018/19 through FY 2022/23 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) by adding funding for the U2C Program: Bay Street Innovation Corridor, and Programming for TCAR II: JTA Transportation Planning.

- North Florida TPO received a Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG) Fueling presentation by David Stubbs, JaxPort's Director of Properties and Environmental Compliance. Eagle LNG Partners supplies LNG bunker fuel from their plant in Maxville to Crowley Maritime and Tote Maritime at JaxPort. The decision by the International Maritime Organization (IMO) to introduce a global 0.50 percent sulfur cap on vessel emissions in 2020 is impacting bunker fuel selection by the maritime industry.
