- 1. Call to Order/Verify Quorum: Chair Crosby called the meeting to order at 6:32 p.m. Michelle Godwin-Ware verified a quorum.
- 2. Approval of the Previous Meeting Summary: The summary for May 9, 2022, meeting was approved by the CPAC.
- 3. Elected Officials' Reports:

Nikki Evans, Executive Assistant to Council Member at Large Group 2, Ron Salem, reported that the Mental Health Offenders Program (MHOP) has been highly successful and is now a permanent program. A total of 14 participants have graduated from the program. All graduates have received treatment and live independently in partnership with Sulzbacher to ensure they continue to receive the support they need. The program is so successful that the State of Florida is looking to apply it to every municipality that may require the program. Ms. Evans also reported that Council Member Salem was elected City Council Vice President. Ms. Evans said she prepares a report after attending each CPAC meeting for Council Member Salem's review.

- Jacksonville Sheriff's Office (JSO) Lt. Bradley Shivers reported that a deployment has been placed in the Five Points area to curb the various Car Clubs' dangerous street racing occurring during the evenings. - 6. Jacksonville Fire & Rescue Department (JFRD) Captain Damian Bell reported that The City of Jacksonville Emergency Preparedness Division is preparing for hurricane season. Captain Bell encouraged everyone to prepare their emergency kits and familiarize themselves with their evacuation zones and nearest shelter if they haven't already done so. Caption Bell reminded CPAC members that JFRD provides and installs free smoke detectors for any qualifying Jacksonville resident living in a single-family

- 7. Capital Improvement Plan/Chairs Report: Chair Crosby suggested four Capital Improvement projects be submitted to the Capital Improvement Plan Administrator Teresa Eichner submitted by the Southwest CPAC:
 - Replacement or repair of drainage through the Cecil Pines Adult Living property.
 - Request for a comprehensive plan to update and enhance Fishweir Park, providing easier access for the disabled and families with strollers.
 - Installation of a basketball court at Tempest Park South, so children don't have to play basketball in the street.
 - Repair and improvements to Cecil Pines Golf Course. The property has fallen into decline.

The CPAC approved the four CIP suggestions provided by various members and community leaders within the Southwest CPAC Planning District 4 five to one, with CPAC member Bruce Tyson opposing the ranking order request. The suggestions will be submitted to Ms. Eichner no later than Friday, June 17, 2022.
