## **Meeting Summary**

- 1. Call to Order/Verify Quorum: Chair Shirley Lowry called the meeting to order at 6:31 p.m. Michelle Godwin-Ware verified a quorum.
- 2. Approval of the Previous Meeting Summary: October's summary will be approved at January's meeting.

- 5. Jacksonville Sheriff's Office (JSO) Lt. Dennis Pellot reported that auto burglaries have increased. Please remove firearms from vehicles so they are not stolen and used for burglaries. Lt. Pellot may be contacted at (904) 573-3165
- 6. Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department (JFRD) Caption Eric Courtis, advised CPAC members to download the JaxReady mobile app. The application will help monitor weather threats, provides information on evacuations, status of shelters, COVID-19 testing sites and financial assistance. Capt. Courtis advised that hospitals are in good shape and are not near compacity for Covid-19 cases. Capt. Courtis also advised that most chimneys have 15-year manufacturers guarantee, so if your chimney or fireplace is over 15 years old, you should have it inspected.

- CPAC Chair and Vice Chair Elections Bruce Tyson presented the slate of nominees for 2021 CPAC Chair and Vice: Dr. Willie Crosby for Chair and Christina Purdy for Vice Chair. Member Tyson ensured there were no additional nominations (by asking three times). Member Martin motioned to approve Dr. Crosby as Chair; Linda Barrow seconded. The motion passed unanimously. Member Martin motioned to approve Christina Purdy as Vice Chair; Linda Barrow seconded. The motion passed unanimously. Dr. Crosby will serve as Chair and Christina Purdy will serve as Vice Chair in 2021.
- **LUZ Subcommittee** Dr. Crosby reported that the subcommittee reviewed three applications and motioned to take no action on them. The subcommittee did have additional questions regarding an application with the tracking number Z-3051.
  - **E-20-67 Zoning Exception** 9680 Argyle Forest Blvd., Suite 1: This application is a First Watch Café and seeks the sale of alcohol on the existing patio.
  - 2020-0664 Rezoning to Conventional Zoning District 6550 Alvin Rd.: This application seeks to rezone 0.97 acres of a property from Residential Rural-Acre (RR-Acre) to Residential Low Density-60 (RLD-60). The request is being sought to increase the allowed density and subdivide the property at a later date.
  - Z-3051 Rezoning to Conventional Zoning District 4250 Matador Dr.: This application seeks to
    permit infill development of market rate housing within an economically distressed area of the
    city.

- North Florida TPO CAC approved FDOT's request to amend FY 2020/2021 through FY 2024/2025
  Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for three projects: Southside Boulevard (SR115) at
  Deerwood Park intersection improvement, SRA1A at 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue North Pedestrian Improvement,
  and JTA Large UZA Operating Funds for Fix Rout.
- North Florida TPO CAC tabled the CAC bylaws update pending the resolution of several questions.
- North Florida TPO CAC received a presentation by Christina Nalsen from FDOT on Mobility Week, is a statewide celebration of making smart, efficient and safe transportation choices.
- North Florida TPO CAC received a presentation by Marci Larsen and Victoria Pennington on the rollout of the TPO's new website, which will replace the current website after review.
