Jacksonville Sheriff's Office (JSO): Lieutenant Raymond Beltz reported the following information for Zone 5 in the last 30 days:

• There was one murder case closed by an arrest.

- Auto burglaries are up by 28%. Auto burglaries can be prevented by keeping your vehicle's doors locked while you are away from the car.
- There were three robberies of individuals. One of those robberies led to an arrest.
- Sheriff T.K. Waters and Jacksonville Sheriff's Office members will conduct a Sheriff's Walk in the Sherwood Forest Community on Saturday, March 11, 2023.

Jacksonville Fire and Rescue (JFRD): Captain Damian Bell shared the following information:

- Sunday, March 12, 2023, is the start of daylight-saving time. This is an excellent time to check the batteries in your home smoke detectors.
- Be patient on the roadways as daylight saving time has us "losing an hour" this season, so irritability can be a factor as we drive.
- Remember to clean out dryer vents after every wash cycle. It is also essential to clean loose debris and lint behind the dryer.
- Be sure to always read the product label before using or mixing a cleaning product. Mixing bleach with common cleaning products can cause serious injuries.
- It is encouraged to have an up-to-date first aid kit in your vehicle.
