- **5.** Chair Report: Chair Green announced that he has requested that Public Works put together a presentation for the North CPAC. The presentation will touch on the plans for infrastructure for the next five years in the North, Planning District 6. Representatives will present on April 13, 2022.
- 6. Staff Reports:
- Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department (JFRD) District Chief Byron Jackson reported that JFRD provides and installs free smoke detectors for any qualifying Jacksonville resident living in a single-family or two-family residence. The department will also install replacement batteries in existing smoke detectors at no charge. - Jacksonville Electric Authority (JEA) Donald Tuten, Government Relations Specialist, reported that JEA is taking measures to secure infrastructure, communication lines, and the Internet because of the current conflict between Russia and Ukraine. Mr. Tuten also reported that JEA is installing Global Positioning Systems (GPS) units on all service vehicles, allowing JEA dispatchers to locate the closest truck in an area when there is an outage. - Municipal Code Compliance Department (MCCD) Charles Benson, Code Compliance Supervisor, reported that a total of 1136 inspections were completed for February. A total of 5800 inspections were completed for the fiscal year. Mr. Benson reminded CPAC members that applications for the Jacksonville Assistance and Relief Program (JAR) are still being accepted. The JAR program assists with required abatement services at no cost to those citizens who qualify. Mr. Benson reminded CPAC members that citizens must provide a name and address in order for the MCCD to perform an inspection. Tickets submitted anonymously will be closed out. Mr. Benson also provided several updates from February's CPAC meeting:
  - MCC officers continue to monitor the property located at 1234 Glenn Dr. State Environmental Agents, and JSO have been brought to the property to assist.
  - Citations have been issued to several properties along Yellow Bluff Road. MCC officers are monitoring the area regularly.
  - MCC officers have investigated Biscayne Boulevard to locate the source of trash in the area. The
    officers could not find the source but have requested Public Works to send a crew to clean the
    area.
  - Citations have been issued to the surrounding properties near the homeless camp at Dunn Avenue and Wingate Road to encourage property owners to maintain the property.

- Public Works (PW) Dave McDaniel, Chief of Mowing and Landscape Maintenance, reported that public works is preparing for hurricane season and is coordinating with emergency management, inspecting evacuation routes, and coordinating debris sites. - Governmental Affairs and Planning & Development Jamie Lacy and Erin Abney, City Planner II, reported that the Governmental Affairs Subcommittee reviewed six Land Use and Zoning applications with the CPAC, and three recommendations were made:

## **New Business**

- Oppose 2022-0147 Conventional Rezoning: 0 Zoo Parkway (RE:111061-0300): This application seeks to rezone approximately 18.51+/- acres from Industrial Water (W) to Industrial Heavy (H). The CPAC believes there is no rationale for the requested change.
- Oppose 2022-0140 Planned Unit Development: 13961New Kings Rd.: This application seeks to rezone approximately 104.24+/- acres from Agriculture (AGR) to Planned Unit Development. The property will be developed with 100 single-family dwelling units with 50 ft. lots at 5,500 sq. ft. The CPAC is opposed to 50 ft. lots and would like the lot sizes to be increased to 60 ft. lots with fewer homes built on the 104.24+/- acres.
- Oppose 2022-0149 Planned Unit Development: 1057 Broward Rd.: This application seeks to

rezone approximately 8.85+/- acres from CCG-1 to PUD to develop the property with up to 230 multi-family dwelling units. The CPAC opposes the application because it is inconsistent with what it asks. The application needs to be clarified.

All motions to approve the Governmental Affair's Subcommittee recommendations were seconded and approved by the CPAC members.
