IV. Executive Director's Report

a. LIVINGOOD, Joshua R. Application for Disability Pension Update

Timothy Johnson said that the Advisory Committee tabled this application in January, and instructed PFPF Staff to send the Medical Director's letter to JSO HR. The letter contained in today's meeting materials is JSO HR's response. Counsel requests no discussion on the application today, as the application is still incomplete. JSO's fitness for duty process is

ongoing. There is nothing else to report other than we have received JSO HR's response. This may or may not be on March's agenda depending on the process.

Richard Reichard asked, hypothetically, if the Advisory Committee has the right to revisit disability pensioners to assess if their disability status has improved, and no longer would be disabled.

Bob Sugarman said the pension system has the right and the obligation to periodically review benefits. The obligation goes a step further – if any member of the Advisory Committee or Board of Trustees has information on a member inconsistent with their alleged disability status, for instance, a member received a disability pension based on a back injury, but is now riding in the rodeo, this information must be presented. There should be periodic reexaminations depending on the extent of the disability. If a member engages in inconsistent activities, the Board of Trustees would consider turning off their pension. The member would be entitled to a hearing.

Bob Sugarman updated the Advisory Committee that he has spoken with Mr. Livingood's attorney and informed them that JSO's fitness for duty process is not a pension process. They are cooperating with the employer, JSO. This process is out of our control.

James Holderfield said that Timothy Johnson sends the Advisory Committee questionnaires, asking for suggestions for improvement of processes. He urged the Advisory Committee to send Timothy Johnson any suggestions they might have as they gain new information. The Advisory Committee has done well recently improving processes.

Michael Shell agreed and said the Advisory Committee has come a long way. The committee has the opportunity to get JSO to modify their accommodation process, and to limit the employer to state to the PFPF whether a member can be accommodated, not be accommodated, or has not responded.

Thomas Lumpkin asked for an update on the retired member, William Baer Jr., who was found guilty of murder.

Bob Sugarman said that Mr. Baer's pension has been forfeited, and that the PFPF has demanded repayment of pension payments to Mr. Baer in excess of his contributions. This is a substantial amount of money. We are currently awaiting response.
