#### IV. Executive Director's Report

Timothy Johnson said he does not often publish a written report to the Committee, but did for today. He said he wanted to give an update on Richard Vercruysse. The Committee approved Mr. Vercruysse's pension benefit in August. The summary is, there was a settlement agreement between the FOP and JSO for his pension to be calculated at a sergeant's salary, although his actual earnings were at a Police Officer's salary. This wasn't explained to the Committee in August. This was driven by the settlement and a court order. He briefly overviewed the attached documents, including the court order and settlement.

Timothy Johnson said he felt that the benefit the Advisory Committee approved in August needed to be explained a bit more for transparency and audit purposes. He said he is working with counsel to determine if records in the file are sufficient. If not, we will go back to the parties and get any additional verifications needed.

Tommy Lumpkin asked if Vercruysse completed his 20 years of service, and if he was a sergeant.

Timothy Johnson said that he did complete 20 years, and that he was a sergeant for some time, although he was demoted to police officer late in his career.

Chuck Hayes discussed a survivor's benefit on today's agenda. William Johnson recently passed, and was married. Mr. Johnson and his wife's health recently declined, and both needed help with assisted living. Mr. Johnson's daughter in California began to care for Mr. Johnson's wife before Mr. Johnson passed.

James Holderfield said in cases like this, when members are in long care facilities, or other circumstances, we like to make sure survivors still qualify for benefit, to ensure they are not estranged.

James Holderfield asked for an update on affidavits.

Chuck Hayes said we are waiting on about 540 affidavits, and would like to reduce this amount before asking the Advisory Committee members for help tracking down members.

Thomas Lumpkin said that the PFPF did a great job at the two summer socials this year. Everyone enjoyed the events and fellowship.

James Holderfield said the attendance at the Firefighters' Union Hall was outstanding. The PFPF did a fantastic job.

### V. Counsel Reports

Lawsikia Hodges said she has nothing to report, and Timothy Johnson did a great job summarizing the Vercruysse case.

Bob Sugarman said that the Board of Trustees accepted the Joshua Livingood benefit be granted. The forfeiture proceeding will also proceed, and the Board is using an Administrative Law Judge to hold the hearing because of unique legal issues. Should be over in the Spring.
