Michael Shell inquired about item B, the application for vested retirement. He said the member in question is involved in a criminal investigation and may be subject to pension forfeiture. He asked if a motion should be made, or if the agenda item should be tabled.

Chuck Hayes said he suggests approving the benefit, and it would be subject to forfeiture later.

James Holderfield said this is how it has been done historically.

Bob Sugarman said he agrees with Chuck Hayes – whether the Advisory Committee approves the benefit or not, it has nothing to do with forfeiture. If convicted, the member would be subject to forfeiture. If the member's pension isn't forfeited now, the application should be approved.

Michael Shell moved to accept the consent agenda as-is, seconded by Thomas Lumpkin. The vote passed unanimously.

IV. Executive Director's Report

a. Advisory Committee Election Update

Steve Lundy updated the Advisory Committee on the Police Trustee election: Trustee Chris Brown was challenged, but the challenger has since withdrawn his candidacy. Assistant Chief Chris Brown will win another 4 years as Police Trustee by default.

Steve Lundy updated the Advisory Committee on the Retired Advisory Committee Member election. Thomas Lumpkin was challenged for his seat by a retired firefighter, Ivan Mote. This election will be conducted via US mail through a third party election service, which mailed ballots to the retirees on November 2. The retirees have until November 17 to have their ballots postmarked in order for their vote to be counted. The certified election results should be ready for the December Advisory Committee meeting.

Thomas Lumpkin asked Steve Lundy to discuss the envelope containing the ballot which was mailed to retirees for the election.

Steve Lundy said that the envelope is nondescript, and that he asked the third party election service to include a line on the outside of the envelope stating that it is regarding the PFPF Advisory Committee Member Election. He said he has since been notified that the third party election service failed to put this on the envelope as requested. He said there has been some confusion, but if any member throws away a ballot, they can contact him for a replacement.

James Holderfield informed the Advisory Committee that the PFPF has been sending out 'next of kin' contact information forms to members, and to encourage members to complete the form and return it to the pension office.

V. Counsel Reports

Bob Sugarman said that the Board of Trustees is considering pension forfeiture of retired police officer and convicted murderer, William R. Baer Jr., on its agenda this month.

Lawsikia Hodges said she has no new information to present to the Advisory Committee this month.
