

WHEREAS: Nine years have passed since 16-year-old Tiphne Hollis of Jacksonville

was riding in a car with family and friends on March 20, 2010, and shots rang out. Tiphne was fatally struck by a stray bullet, and her

murder remains unsolved; and

WHEREAS: The Jacksonville community continues to mourn the loss of this

promising Ed White High School student, as well as the untimely

deaths of too many other victims of violent crimes; and

WHEREAS: The Tiphne Dar'Shay Hollis (TDH) Foundation, Inc., a nonprofit

organization established by her family, is committed to raising awareness of senseless gun violence. The foundation leads charitable acts, supports youth and educational opportunities, and hosts outreach events with the goal of building a safer community and a bright future

for all of Jacksonville's children; and

WHEREAS: The TDH Foundation continues to honor Tiphne's memory through

community enrichment efforts and support to local families suffering from the devastating loss of loved ones to gun violence. The City of Jacksonville is also proud to support the afterschool programs of the TDH Christian Academy, a school started by Tiphne's mother, Shanda

Whitaker-Ward, in memoriam; and

WHEREAS: On March 20, 2019, a candlelight vigil and walk are being hosted by

Tiphne's family, friends and supporters to advocate for safety in our

community, especially for our youth.
