Locally hosted events bring energy, excitement, vitality and economic gains to communities. Events such as meetings, conventions or trade shows stimulate a region's economy by attracting visitors who stay in area hotels, eat in local restaurants, shop in neighborhood stores and bring new revenue to a community. In Jacksonville, more than 16,000 people visit each day, generating an average of \$3.2 billion annually for the local economy; and

In observance of Global Meetings Industry Day, members of the Convention Industry Council and their network of chapters, as well as members of the MMB coalition, hold events around the world. This includes the Meeting Professionals International North Florida Chapter, which has organized a gathering at TIAA Bank Field on April 4.
