
WHEREAS:	Jacksonville is home to a vibrant and thriving arts & culture sector that

- WHEREAS: Courtney Bryan, whose music has been performed and presented at prestigious venues such as the Lincoln Center, National Gallery of Art, and Blue Note Jazz Club, was announced as the Jacksonville Symphony's Mary Carr Patton Composer-in-Residence in 2018; and
- **WHEREAS:** Courtney Bryan's original composition titled "Bridges"—which celebrates Jacksonville's diverse communities, rich cultural history and the bridges that connect us—will be premiered on April 4, 2019.
