- WHEREAS: In addition to screening, diagnosing and treating hearing, speech and language disorders for thousands of Jacksonville citizens of all ages, the center also regularly hosts community outreach programs and offers hearing aid services provided by audiology professionals; and
- WHEREAS: The Jacksonville community joins in celebrating JSHC's seven decades of essential health services for our citizens.
