effective medications or treatments for gastroparesis; and

**WHEREAS:** Increasing awareness of gastroparesis will further research efforts,

leading to additional treatment and medication options, and hope

for the future; and

WHEREAS: We seek to educate the citizens of Jacksonville, the medical

community, and the general public regarding the devastating effects

of this disorder to increase the quality of life for those affected.
