WHEREAS: As summer approaches and warm weather draws people to local

waterways, National Safe Boating Week is a time to raise awareness of

boating safety precautions that can help save lives; and

**WHEREAS:** On average, 650 people die each year in boating-related accidents in

the United States. Approximately 75% of these incidents are fatalities

caused by drowning; and

WHEREAS: The vast majority of these tragedies are caused not by the boat,

equipment, or environmental factors, but are instead caused by human

error or poor judgment; and

WHEREAS: A significant number of the boaters who lost their lives by drowning

would be alive had they worn life jackets. Life jackets could have

prevented an estimated 86% of boating fatalities; and

WHEREAS: Boat operators and passengers should exercise caution while boating

and should always wear life jackets; and

**WHEREAS:** Unlike the bulky life jackets of the past, today's life jackets are more

comfortable, more attractive and more wearable; and

WHEREAS: As we take advantage of Jacksonville's beautiful and plentiful

waterways to enjoy boating, sailing, paddling or fishing, let us commit to ensuring water safety by exercising appropriate safe boating

procedures.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LENNY CURRY, by virtue of the authority vested in me as mayor

of Jacksonville, Florida, do hereby proclaim May 20 – 26, 2023 as
