WHEREAS: Dr. Diana L. Greene began her career in education 38 years ago as a teacher in

Duval County Public Schools (DCPS) at Mamie Agnes Jones Elementary in Baldwin after earning her Bachelor of Arts Degree in Elementary Education at the University

of North Florida; and

WHEREAS: Dr. Diana L. Greene earned her Master's Degree in Educational Leadership from

NOVA Southeastern University and her Ph.D. in Advanced K-12 Teaching and Learning from Capella University, while serving the students of Marion County for 30 years in various classroom and leadership roles including: Teacher, Assistant Principal, Principal, Director of Staff Development, Deputy Superintendent of

Curriculum, and Deputy Superintendent of Instructional Services; and

WHEREAS: For the last five years, Dr. Diana L. Greene has served the students, parents and

Jacksonville community as the Chief Executive Officer and Superintendent of Duval County Public Schools, one of the most diverse and successful urban school

districts; and

WHEREAS: During her tenure with DCPS, she helped achieve a historically high student

graduation rate, increased the percentage of district schools rated "C" or above to 93%, eliminated all failing, traditional schools from Duval County, implemented significant security measures in the era following the Marjory Stoneman Douglas tragedy, led the passage of the voluntary sales surtax that funded a \$1.9 billion master facilities plan to renovate and replace crumbling schools, and led her stellar team of district leaders and school leaders, teachers, and staff to be among the first school districts in the United States to convert more than 125,000 students, 160 schools, and 13,000 teachers and staff to Duval HomeRoom online learning in one

week, providing education to students during the COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS: Dr. Diana L. Greene has received numerous awards and accolades over her 38-year

career, most notably, Florida Association of District School Superintendents Florida Superintendent of the Year, 2021, making her the 33rd Superintendent and the second African American woman to receive this honor, and finalist for the 2022

Council of Great City Schools National Superintendent of the Year; and

WHEREAS: Dr. Diana L. Greene is a woman of family and faith, a military child who moved

frequently and lived all over the United States and abroad, the daughter of a U.S. Air Force father, and the wife to the love of her life, James Greene, a retired Navy veteran and recently retired Financial Advisor with whom she has two adult sons,

Aldon and Joshua.
