- WHEREAS: Jessie Word managed the J. W. Johnson Family YMCA, including performing administrative duties, coaching youth sports programs, and teaching underserved children to swim. His work laid the foundation for connecting underserved populations with key resources and support; and
- **WHEREAS:** Over the last 75 years, the J. W. Johnson Family YMCA has served generations of Jacksonville families, transforming lives by empowering young people, improving community health and well-being, and inspiring positive action in and across Northwest Jacksonville.
