

## Application Criteria

- The business must be located within the Northwest Jacksonville Economic Development Fund Boundary (see map), with a commercial zoning.
- The business must have a failing septic tank as determined by the Florida Department of Health or identified by a septic tank contractor, certified plumber, or other qualified person identified by the Florida Administrative Code.
- The subject property may not have any pending zoning or building code violations, pending liens, unpaid taxes, or environmental contamination.

## Approval Process

- 1) Business has a failing septic system
- 2) Completes Florida Department of Health Form 4015
- 3) Completes application for Failing Non-Residential Septic Grant
- 4) Provides Engineering Design Proposal quote from a professional engineer (if applicable)
- 5) Upon approval, enters into contractual agreement with the City of Jacksonville
- 6) Obtains three quotes from either a registered/licensed contractor or certified plumber to implement the engineering solution
- 7) Selects contractor – must go with the lowest bidder

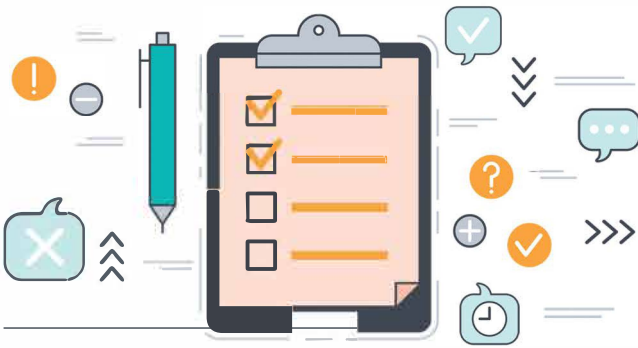
**OFFICE OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT**

# Septic Grant Program (Non-Residential)

This program is designed to provide grants to the owners of commercial properties within the Northwest Jacksonville Economic Development Fund Boundary with failing septic tanks to repair, or remove their failing systems and/or be connected to JEA's sewer system.

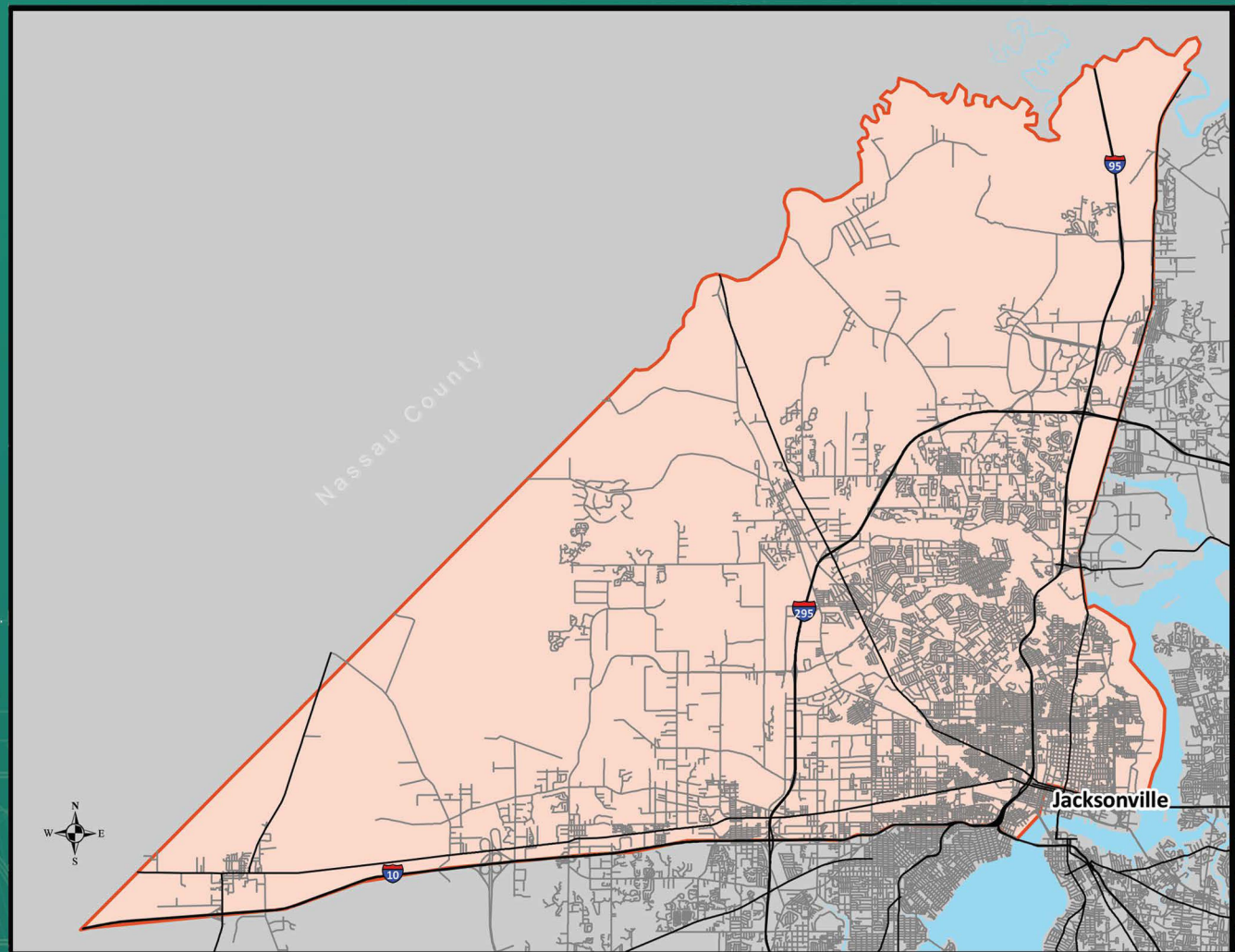
Septic tank failure is determined by the Florida Department of Health or identified by a septic tank contractor, certified plumber, or other qualified person identified by the Florida Administrative Code.

The maximum grant amount is up to \$30,000 per business. The owner is responsible for any additional costs. Funding is subject to availability.
