- UF Health Jacksonville has a total operating budget of \$550 million of which \$350 million is salaries and benefits.



- Maintained <u>4 star quality ranking</u> from UHC, improving our ranking from 42nd to 19th, and sharing <u>the 2012 Rising Star</u> <u>Award with Duke Health and the Cleveland Clinic</u>.










