ORDINANCE 2005-1009-E

AN ORDINANCE CREATING A NEW SECTION 110.368 (DUVAL COUNTY JOB OPPORTUNITY BANK) ORDINANCE CODE, TO FUND ASSISTANCE IN JOB SKILLS TRAINING; ESTABLISHING A NEW CHAPTER 180 (DUVAL COUNTY JOB OPPORTUNITY BANK), ORDINANCE CODE, ESTABLISHING A BOARD, AND PROVIDING FOR UP TO \$50,000 FUNDING PER ECONOMIC ASSISTANCE RECIPIENTS FROM THE JACKSONVILLE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION (JEDC), AND PROVIDING GRANTS TO IMPROVE JOB OPPORTUNITIES FOR LOW INCOME AND LOW PROSEPECTIVE RESIDENTS; PROVIDING FOR APPLICATION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Section 110.368 (Duval County Job Opportunity Bank), Ordinance Code, is hereby created to read as follows:

> CITY TREASURY. CHAPTER 110.

SPECIAL ACCOUNTS AND FUNDS. PART 3.

Sec. 110.368. Duval County Job Opportunity Bank.

There is created the Duval County Job Opportunity Bank, a permanent trust fund of the City, into which shall be paid the funds received pursuant to Section 180.105, Ordinance Code, to Wit: the contributions or disbursements from Economic Assistance Recipients or, as approved by a majority of the City Council, by appropriations within the budget of the City or available grants. Any such funds received by the Director of Procurement shall be deposited into the fund, for the purpose of providing grants and other forms of financial assistance to increase job opportunities for job skills advancement residents of the City, to upgrade their job skills, and to provide customized skills training for new and incumbent workers employed by the City. All such funds shall be accounted for separately within the fund and shall be administered by the Director of Procurement and the Duval County Job Opportunity Board as provided in Chapter 180. All sums placed into the fund are hereby appropriated for distribution in accordance with the appropriate provisions of Chapter 180, Ordinance Code. Any undistributed funds shall not lapse at the close of any fiscal year, but instead shall carry over to the next fiscal year. The Director of Administration and Finance, or his or her designee, is authorized and directed to make disbursements from the fund upon written requisition of the Director of Procurement and approval of the Duval County Job Opportunity Board, subject to the availability of funds in the fund.

Section 2. Chapter 180, Ordinance Code, is hereby created to read as follows:

CHAPTER, 180. DUVAL COUNTY JOB OPPORTUNITY BANK.

- (a) Board shall mean the Board of Directors of the Duval County Job Opportunity Bank.
- (b) City means the Consolidated City of Jacksonville.
- (c) Director means the Director, Department of Procurement.
- (d) Council shall mean the City Council of the Consolidated City of Jacksonville.
- (e) Economic Assistance Recipient means any for profit entity receiving an incentive in the form of a grant, loan, TIF, credit or other form of assistance from or as approved by the Jacksonville Economic Development Commission (the "JEDC").
- (f) Job skills advancement resident means an individual resident of the City whose employment opportunities are restricted by deficiencies or inexperience in education, work experience, work training, work skills, or the loss of certain occupations or industries from the economy of the City and whose job skills deficiencies and residence is certified by the Director.

Sec. 180.103. Establishment of the Duval County Job Opportunity Bank.

There is established the Duval County Job Opportunity Bank for the purpose of providing grants and other forms of financial assistance to increase job opportunities for job skills advancement residents of the City, to upgrade their job skills, and to provide customized skills training for new and incumbent workers employed by City employers.

Sec. 180.104. Duval County Job Opportunity Board.

The Duval County Job Opportunity Bank shall be subject to the general direction of the Board, consisting of four (4) members

appointed by the Mayor, and three (3) members appointed by the President of the City Council, who cumulatively shall representative of the various gender, cultural, ethnic, and racial groups which comprise the population of the City, and who each shall be subject to approval by resolution of the City Council. Members shall not be officers or employees of the City of Jacksonville. Each member shall serve a term of three years. Members may be reappointed and serve for two three year terms. President of the City Council shall designate one of the appointees to serve as the Board Chairperson for a term of two years. members shall be generally experienced in one or more areas relating to job skills development, including but not limited to human resources administration, vocational training, workforce development, employment, higher education, manufacturing, The Board shall service sector and/or apprenticeship programs. establish the policy of the Duval County Job Opportunity Bank and Director in matters concerning the operation and advise the administration of the Duval County Job Opportunity Bank. shall meet at least quarterly or more frequently at the discretion of the Board Chairperson.

The Board shall be subject to the provisions of Chapter 50, Ordinance Code, except as may be provided to the contrary in this Chapter.

Sec. 180.105. Funding of the Duval County Job Opportunity Bank.

(a) The Duval County Job Opportunity Bank as established in Section 110.368, Ordinance Code, shall be funded by contributions or disbursements from Economic Assistance Recipients or, as approved by a majority of the City Council, by appropriations within the budget of the City or available grants.

Each Economic Assistance Recipient shall remit to the Director, for deposit into the Duval County Job Opportunity Bank as 110.368, Ordinance Code, established in Section an amount negotiated by the JEDC with the Economic Assistance Recipient as part of the incentives agreement, provided however that the sum remitted shall be an amount no less than 1% of the maximum amount anticipated to be received as locally provided economic assistance. If the Economic Assistance Recipient is to receive any real property, then the 1% amount shall be based upon 1% of the fair property approved рv the value o.f the as Notwithstanding this formula, no Economic Assistance Recipient shall be required to remit more than \$50,000.00 for any single project approved by the JEDC. The incentives agreement shall provide for the remittance within thirty (30) days of contract execution. As part of the project approval process by the City Council, the JEDC shall report in a separate line item the amount each economic assistance recipient is to remit. The Council shall consider as a factor in its approval deliberations for agreements it approves, whether, in its opinion and judgment, the amount to be remitted to the Job Opportunity Bank is adequate and proportionate to the economic assistance received. The JEDC shall treat the funding of the Job Opportunity Bank as a significant factor in negotiating economic assistance projects and giving approval to the same.

Sec. 180.106. Administration of the Duval County Job Opportunity Bank.

(a) No funds shall be released from the Duval County Job Opportunity Bank, unless approved by the Board, nor until the balance in the Duval County Job Opportunity Bank reaches the amount of \$100,000. In the first year that the balance of funds in the

Duval County Job Opportunity Bank reaches \$100,000, any funds exceeding \$100,000 may be released as provided in this Chapter.

- (b) Funds may be released from the Duval County Job Opportunity Bank in any succeeding calendar year or portion thereof following the initial distribution of funds from the Duval County Job Opportunity Bank when the balance of the Duval County Job Opportunity Bank exceeds \$250,000; provided a reserve of \$250,000 remains in the Duval County Job Opportunity Bank at all times. In the event that the reserve in the fund is less than \$250,000 at any time following the initial distribution of funds, no further funds may be disbursed until the reserve reaches \$250,000.
- (c) Duval County Job Opportunity Bank funds shall be maintained in the *Duval County Job Opportunity Bank* trust account identified in Section 110.368, *Ordinance Code*.

Sec. 180.107. Eligibility for Grants.

±5

The following individuals or entities shall be eligible to receive grants or other assistance from the Duval County Job Opportunity Bank.

- (a) Job skills advancement residents;
- (b) Businesses resident in and/or regularly conducting business in the City, human resource and employment training organizations, trade associations, labor organizations, business coalitions in the City, workforce development providers or non-profit organizations partnered with City businesses or business coalitions seeking to hire job skills advancement residents, provide job skills training for the same, and develop a workforce from those individuals; or
- (c) City businesses resident in and/or regularly conducting business in the City, trade associations, labor organizations, business coalitions, workforce development providers or non-profit

organizations partnered with City businesses or business coalitions seeking to upgrade the skills of their current workforce, composed of at least 51% City residents, in order to maintain the employment of the current workforce.

Grant applications and priorities. Sec. 180.108.

- Grant applications shall be made at the time and in the manner designated by the Director.
- Grant applications shall include a detailed budget, cost analysis, identifiable performance benchmarks, and general description of the employment benefits to be derived by the recipient.
- (c) Grant applications made by City businesses resident in and regularly conducting business in the City, trade associations, labor organizations, business coalitions and partnered non-profit organizations shall also include a proposed workforce development program model demonstrating an effective approach to increasing the employability of program participants or the retention of their current workforce and which is directly linked to existing or anticipated employment opportunities.
- In evaluating grant applications for decisions as funding, the Director shall give priority, but in no particular order, to those applications which the Director determines best serve job skills advancement residents in the following categories:
 - Youths between 18 and 21 years of age; (1)
 - Chronically un-employed or under-employed (2) individuals;
 - (3)Dislocated workers;
 - Ex-offenders; and (4)
 - In determining whether to fund grant applications, (e)

Director shall consider, in addition to the criteria set forth in subsections (c) and (d) of this section, the amount of funds available in the Duval County Job Opportunity Bank; available and reliable information concerning the current and future labor market; the non-duplication of funding available through the federal Workforce Investment Act of 1998, approved August 7, 1998 (112 Stat. 936; 29 U.S.C. § 2822) and other federal, state, or local job development and job training programs; and any prior experience of the applicant with job training or workforce development programs.

Sec. 180.109. Grant Agreements.

Any individual, entity or entities awarded grants shall, as a condition for the receipt of funds from the Duval County Job Opportunity Bank, enter into a grant agreement with the Director, the form and contents of which shall be specified by the Director, but which shall minimally contain the following:

- (a) Information concerning the name, address and telephone number of any individual grant recipient.
- (b) The name, address, telephone number and identity of corporate officers or principal owners, the registered agent of any incorporated recipient; and names of the entity's or individual's banks and account numbers.
- (c) Provisions holding harmless and releasing the City, its officers, employees and assigns from any and all liabilities, including those associated with or derived from the acceptance of Job Opportunity Bank funds, subsequent training and any subsequent efforts at obtaining employment.
- (d) Provisions guaranteeing the right of the Director to access any and all records of expenditures made with Job Opportunity Bank funds and the right of access to bank or other

financial records of all recipients of grants in the amount of \$5,000 or more.

- (e) Acknowledgment by the recipient of the right of the Director to:
 - (1) Monitor expenditure of funds;
 - (2) Require reports from recipients regarding expenditures, progress, or performance in meeting identified benchmarks, and any other financial or operational information deemed necessary to the Director; and
 - (3) Inspect the recipient's records to obtain the identified information;
- (f) Acknowledgment by the recipient that the Director may curtail or cancel payment of funds from the Job Opportunity Bank if the recipient does not comply with the requirements of this section; and
- (g) Acknowledgement by the recipient that all the information provided in the application and grant process is true to the best of the recipient's knowledge, information, and belief, and that the recipient acknowledges the existence of criminal and civil penalties for the provision of false information.

Sec. 180.110. Rulemaking Authority.

The Director shall promulgate and the Board shall approve regulations to implement this chapter. The rules shall be approved by March 31, 2006.

Sec. 180.111. Monitoring.

The JEDC will forward a copy of any agreement for economic assistance to the Director within 30 after execution of the agreement. The Director shall monitor compliance with the payment obligations of Economic Assistance Recipients, and shall monitor

and evaluate the performance of grantees pursuant to regulations established as required by Section 180.110. The Director may terminate or modify grant agreements if the Director determines that the grantee's performance is not in accordance with the grant. Grantees who have their grants cancelled or modified may appeal the Director's action to the Duval County Job Opportunity Board. The decision of the Duval County Job Opportunity Board shall be final and shall not be subject to judicial review.

Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature. The funds required to be submitted to the Director of Procurement as required by Section 2 above, shall apply to contracts approved after the effective date of this ordinance.
