The Chairman brought the meeting to order at 9:05 a.m.

The Board of Trustees recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

The Chair recognized Robert Klausner, Fund General Counsel. Mr. Klausner requested that the Board go into Executive Session pursuant to Florida Statute 286.011(8) to discuss legal strategy in the case of Frank Denton v. Mayor Alvin Brown, the City of Jacksonville and the Pension Fund's Board of Trustees, Duval County Case No. 2013-CA-5799. The Chairman called the roll and advised that the persons in attendance are Bobby Deal, Walt Bussells, Adam Herbert, John Keane, and Bob Klausner. A court reporter is also present and will steno graphically record the session. At the conclusion of the litigation, the transcript will become a public document. During the Executive Session, Trustee Glover arrived and because he was not present when the session began, he was excused from the session upon advice of the Board counsel, and did not participate.

The Board was advised that no motions or action may be taken during the closed session.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY WALT BUSSELLS TO GO INTO EXECUTIVE SESSION. ADAM HERBERT SECONDED THE MOTION WHICH PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

The closed session started at 9:07 a.m.

The meeting was reconvened at 9:47 a.m.

Mr. Klausner gave a summary of the Executive Session for Trustee Glover who was not present. He stated that Judge Wallace issued an unfavorable ruling for our position. A motion for rehearing was filed and discussed with the Board. Judge Wallace's ruling has already been used in other litigation that in the opinion of Board Counsel was contrary to the interests of the Fund. In response to an inquiry from a trustee, Board Counsel advised that it was in the Board's exercise of its fiduciary duty to pursue the motion for rehearing and if the motion is denied to appeal.

ADAM HERBERT MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE MOTION FOR REHEARING, AND IF DENIED, TO APPEAL. THE MOTION WAS SECONDED BY WALT BUSSELLS WITH THE UNDERSTANDING THAT THE APPEAL CAN BE WITHDRAWN IF A RESOLUTION CAN BE REACHED. THERE IS A 30 DAY PERIOD TO FILE THE APPEAL. THE MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

TRUSTEE BUSSELLS NOTED THAT COST MANAGEMENT WAS IMPORTANT AND THAT STAFF WOULD BE ATTENTIVE TO THAT. ADAM HERBERT NOTED FOR THE RECORD THAT HE IS CONCERNED ABOUT THE LITIGATION THAT NOT JUST THE FUND, BUT OUR SOCIETY IS CONSTANTLY GOING THROUGH AND HOPES WE REACH THE POINT WHERE IT IS NOT NECESSARY. WALT BUSSELLS, NAT GLOVER, AND BOB KLAUSNER AGREED.

PUBLIC SPEAKING PERIOD

Curtis Lee complained that handouts to the Board members were not available to guests before the meeting which makes it difficult for him to comment on agenda items. He pointed out that both the Corrections Pension Board and the General Employee Board provided handouts before the meeting.

The Board told the staff to post the hand outs when the agenda is posted. Mr. Klausner also suggested having a packet of all handouts available at the meeting.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Investment Report

2014-01-1 Investment Reports from Summit Strategy.

Dan Holmes, Summit Strategies, went over the December 2013 Flash Report with the Board. Chairman Deal asked if he could give an estimate on the total return and total return net of fees for the calendar year. Mr. Holmes said that the net return was 18.7%, gross was 19.3%. Trustee Bussells asked what the GE Pension did and Mr. Holmes said they had 22% gross.

Trustee Bussells noted that Eaton Vance is under performing their benchmark. Dan says they are doing what they are supposed to do and have had less than a year with this product. He does however recommend terminating Fayez Sarofim. Earlier last year, we removed half of their portfolio and they underperformed their benchmark by over 10% last year. We left the remaining money with

them as insurance against a sudden drop from Fed tampering which didn't happen. We should put the money in the S&P 500 Index Fund.

ADAM HERBERT MADE A MOTION TO TERMINATE FAYEZ SAROFIM AND TRANSFER THE FUNDS TO THE NORTHERN TRUST S&P 500 INDEX FUND. THE MOTION WAS SECONDED BY NAT GLOVER AND PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

Since Franklin Templeton will not give us a side letter, Mr. Holmes will present recommendations for other companies that will handle that type of investing we were looking for. Chairman Deal asked that he consider minority firms in his search which Trustee Glover agreed.
