INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

Honorable Members of the City Council City of Jacksonville

We have examined the accompanying statement of county funded court-related functions of the City of Jacksonville, Florida for the year ended September 30, 2012 pursuant to Section 29.0085 of the Florida Statutes. This statement is the responsibility of the management of the City's Finance Department. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on this statement based on our examination.

Our examination was made in accordance with attestation standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, and accordingly, included such procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances. We believe that our examination provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

In our opinion, the statement referred to above is presented, in all material respects, in conformity with Sections 29.008 and 29.0085 of the Florida Statutes, except for the requirement to maintain the same funding level for "Existing Radio Systems" per F.S. 29.008(4)(a)&(c). Although the local requirement expenditures for the combined total of "Legal Aid" and "Alternative Sanctions Coordinators" was not maintained at a level equal to the prior year, it is noted on the attached schedule that additional General Fund dollars totaling \$287,290.01 were provided by the County to support legal aid programs.

In reviewing the information on the 2011/12 report for the City of Jacksonville we became aware of an issue with two lines on last year's report. The "Lease/Rent Expense" lines for the Clerk of Circuit Courts and the State Courts columns were overstated \$150,978.44 and \$2,111,454.15, respectively. The total funding provided should be \$88,957,118.65 instead of \$91,219,551.24. These changes would not have impacted whether the City of Jacksonville met the funding requirements in the prior year.
