James P. Small Memorial Stadium, constructed in 1912, is a historic staple of the District 8, Durkeeville Community, located at 1701 Myrtle Avenue North, Jacksonville, FL.

IN THE LAST 100 DAYS, Councilwoman Pittman had the opportunity to tour District 8 and identified specific issues of concerns immediately:

1. Approved budget to address the following: Sidewalks \$6M, Sewage/Drainage \$30M, \$300M Septic Tanks, \$10M Cemetery Restoration, Develop a Farmer's/Vocational Training Centers \$1.5M, Stop the Violence Initiative \$350K, Beautification Initiative \$1.7M and more.
2. Partnered with Greenscape/Enterprise Rental Car to sponsor a Tree Give-Away at St. Clara Elementary School
3. Volunteered with distributing food at the Household of Faith Conference Center and Feeding Northeast Florida.
4. I have visited 3 senior community centers, 27 parks, 10 schools, 45 businesses in the district and attended many community meetings.
5. Met with many constituents and businesses to hear what "YOU" expect.
6. Discussions with the Office of Economic Development regarding the need for grocery stores and business opportunities in the district.
7. Held three Town Hall Meetings.
8. Established the District 8 Ambassador Initiative.
