

What is the Edward Waters College Promise?

The EWC PROMISE is a commitment to "first-time-in-college" students having graduated from a local county high school seeking a four-year bachelor's degree. 100 students are considered based on financial and transportation needs.

The Edward Waters College Promise Program is the First Program in the nation established by a four-year institution toward <u>student debt elimination</u>. It is the first Promise Program by a Historical Black College or University. #EWCollegePromise

Who is eligible to apply for The Promise?

The Promise serves the most financially at-risk students and works with need-based income thresholds for those who seek a degree in the fields of **Biology**, **Business**, **Communications**, **Criminal Justice**, **Elementary Education**, **Mathematics**, **Music**, or **Psychology**.

How do you qualify for The Promise?

- Complete the EWC admissions application for the fall 2018 term. To apply, go to: www.ewc.edu. Contact: Admissions Office: 904-470-8200; admissions@ewc.edu.
- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid Form (FAFSA) and be eligible to receive the federal Pell grant. FAFSA website: www.fafsa.ed.gov and EWC's FAFSA code: 001478.
- Receive an acceptance letter from the EWC Office of Admissions.
- Must be a commuter student.
