As part of the continuing remediation activities under Project New Ground, ETM is currently working on the engineering and quality control and program management for the active remediation project called 5th and Cleveland Part 7. Approximately 25 new parcels need to be added to ETM's engineering oversight of the remediation construction since additional access agreements have been obtained. Additionally, the construction time frame for both the 5th and Cleveland Part 7 and the Lonnie Miller Park will extend well into FY 18-19 and we need to extend the program management duties to September 30, 2019. Additional work tasks and fee summary in Amendment #16 are needed to complete the project.

Accordingly, this is to recommend that the contract, between the City and England-Thims and Miller, Inc. for Program Director for contaminated Site Remediation, is amended to (i) incorporate the Attached Scope of Services identified as Exhibit "EE"; incorporating the attached Contract Fee Summary Form identified as Exhibit "FF"; by increasing the amount for Program Management by \$373,627.80 and QA/QC engineering oversight and completion reports for the additional parcels by \$197,625.90 to a new total of \$571,253.70 as identified in Exhibit "FF"; and increase the maximum indebtedness by \$\$571,253.70 to a new not-to-exceed total maximum indebtedness of \$39,249,734.94. All other terms and conditions, as previously amended, shall remain the same. Nothing contained herein shall be amended, modified, or otherwise revised without prior approval from PSEC and the Mayor.

EXHIBIT "EE" SCOPE OF SERVICES ASH SITE REMEDIATION

1.0 BACKGROUND

England, Thims & Miller, Inc. (ETM) has a Contract (Architectural/Engineering Services as Program Director for Contaminated Site Remediation) with the City of Jacksonville (the City) to serve as the City's Program Director for the remediation of ash contaminated sites within the City. The main focus of the remediation efforts has been the four EPA-jurisdictional sites that have Records of Decision (RODs), i.e. Brown's Dump Site, 5th and Cleveland Incinerator Site, Forest Street Incinerator Site, and Lonnie Miller Park Site.

All four EPA-jurisdictional sites have undergone remediation and to date, approx. 1,650 parcels have been remediated. Remediation activities are anticipated through 2019 including 5th and Cleveland Incinerator Site - Part 7A and the remaining (Remnant) parcels within the Sites.

The current Contract is scheduled to expire on September 30, 2018 and shall be extended to September 30, 2019.

The scope of this Amendment is to provide continued Program Director services as required by the Consent Decree and contemplated under the original contract. These services include:

- Program Management
- Institutional Control Only Completion Reports

2.0 PROGRAM MANAGEMENT (Task 1)

ETM will continue to provide program management and other related professional services necessary to oversee and implement the remediation/construction of the four EPA jurisdictional sites including the OU-2 areas. Program Management services shall include progress reporting to EPA, conducting project meetings, EPA coordination and response to comments, maintenance of project records and the program management/project status tool, coordination of sampling and analyses for EPA forced sampling, and providing public outreach support. In addition, this task shall include database management of the Phase 3 and confirmation sampling and analyses as well as submittal to the EPA DART system.

The services included in Program Management are described below.

2.1 PROGRESS REPORTING AND MEETINGS

ETM will provide status reports to the City and EPA detailing recent and current significant actions, status of each site, updated payment status and current schedules. ETM will attend or conduct meetings with and respond to comments from the City and EPA staff as required.

2.2 PROJECT RECORD-KEEPING & DATABASE MANAGEMENT

ETM will provide access to and training in "Buzzsaw" (a web based collaborative project management toolset developed and supported by AutoDesk) for City staff and the DB Firms. The DB Firms prepare data, documents, drawings, reports and other deliverables or communications related to the sites which shall be uploaded and stored in the appropriate folders within Buzzsaw. ETM has prepared the process workflow and forms within Buzzsaw and maintains them for use by the DB Firms.

Buzzsaw and GIS support will be provided by ETM. This support includes database and GIS support. ETM will receive field data, QC the data received, and enter it into the project database. Upon completion of Phase 3 sampling as well as confirmation sampling and analyses, ETM will submit the data to the EPA DART system.

ETM will continue to maintain the program management/project status tool which provides the overall project status.

2.3 PUBLIC OUTREACH SUPPORT

ETM will provide support to the City and the City's Public Outreach Consultant in their public outreach efforts during the construction efforts. This support may include, but is not limited to, meeting on a regular basis with the City and the Public Outreach Consultant, attendance at community meetings, and providing graphics and maps for public outreach meetings. In addition, ETM will assist the City and their Public Outreach Consultant in responding to citizens regarding the site remediation.

3.0 INSTITUTIONAL CONTROL ONLY COMPLETION REPORTS (Task 2)

ETM will prepare Completion Reports for parcels that cannot be sampled and/or remediated due to existing impervious surfaces that prevent sampling and/or remediation as well as parcels that are commercially or industrially zoned but have residential Remedial Goal exceedances that do not require remediation at this time.

These Completion Reports will allow the City to finalize the parcels from further action with regards to the Consent Decree. These Completion Reports will include a summary of the current conditions, the Preliminary Design Plan, an Institutional Control Plan and existing pictures of the site.

There are approximately 200 parcels (including all the Sites) that require an Institutional Control Only Completion Report. This work will be conducted for a Lump Sum Fee of \$197,625.90, including expenses.

The Engineering Division has negotiated with the consultant selected for Professional Services for Miscellaneous Dredge and Waterway Infrastructure Projects Citywide, resulting in the attached Scope of Services, Exhibit A and Contract Fee Schedule, Exhibit B. MBE firms to be utilized to meet the 20% Participation Percentage Plan for this contract are detailed on a separate attachment.

Accordingly, this is to recommend that the City of Jacksonville enter into a contract with RS&H, Inc. for Professional Services for Miscellaneous Dredge and Waterway Infrastructure Projects Citywide, that includes the attached Scope of Services identified as Exhibit "A" and Fee Schedule identified as Exhibit "B". Each project performed under this agreement shall be authorized by an individual Purchase Order with a not-to-exceed cost applicable thereto. The maximum indebtedness of the City pursuant to this agreement is \$1,000,000.00. The initial Period of Service will be for Two (2) years from the contract execution date, with the option to extend such contract for two (2) additional two (2) year periods upon satisfactory performance by the Consultant. All other terms and conditions are as provided in the RFP and the City's standard contract language.

EXHIBIT A

Description of Services and Deliverables

This is a Request for Proposals (RFP) from Consultants to provide professional engineering, architecture, landscape architecture, planning, environmental assessment, geotechnical, surveying, environmental permitting, and all other services as may be needed by the City for Miscellaneous Dredge and Waterway Infrastructure Projects located in the City of Jacksonville. Typical projects may include but are not limited to, dredging of navigable waterways, maintenance dredging, evaluation, repairs and replacement of bulkheads, seawalls and retaining walls, new fixed and floating docks, fishing piers, boat ramps, and associated features as required. A detailed scope of services and fee therefore will be negotiated for each project on which the City requests services. Services may consist of a study, conceptual design, final design and/or post design construction phase services. Services for each project will be authorized by the issuance of separate Purchase Orders clearly stating the maximum fee for such services.

The City intends to award one contract for all related projects citywide. The exact number of individual projects anticipated needing professional services under each this contract is not known at this time. Therefore, the City does not guarantee a minimum or maximum level of services required during any given contract year.

It is anticipated that services will generally be performed in accordance with the following:

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It is anticipated that services will generally be performed in accordance with the following:

- A. Existing waterway infrastructure: Perform initial assessment and project prioritization based on currently know information on age, and conditions; Perform physical inspections and prepare reports recommending corrective actions; Provide permitting and design services, and prepare bidding documents for the recommended repairs/replacements; Perform CEI services during construction phase.; and Develop and execute periodic Preventative Maintenance Inspection Program.
- B. New waterway infrastructure and dredging: A Consultant selected specifically for each project usually performs the design of dredge, dock, boat ramps and other new waterway projects. However, numerous small projects are anticipated in this RFP and a single Consultant under a continuing contract can best provide the required services. Therefore, work by the Consultant selected under this RFP may include, but not necessarily be limited to, the planning and design of dredge, dock, boat ramp and other new waterway projects. Such work may require planning, surveying, architecture, engineering (including civil, structural, mechanical, electrical, fire protection and others), recreational consulting, landscape architecture, site or drainage design, environmental permitting and/or other professional services.
- C. Design services under this contract, although primarily related to improvements in or around the water, may also include other projects upon which the City may need architectural or engineering services.
- D. It is intended that Consultant's services will result in all drawings, specifications, and other documents needed for the City to acquire any necessary land or easements, adjust utilities and make connections thereto, seek bids, obtain permits, and contract for construction of each project. The Consultant may

be required to prepare presentation materials illustrating concepts, participate in public meetings to obtain citizen input, and modify each design accordingly.

EXHIBIT A

- E. Consultant's services on each project may be in several phases: Study/Conceptual Design (including master planning), Final Design, and Post Design/Construction Phase Engineering, with separate negotiation and fee for each phase. At the City's option upon completion of each phase, Consultant's services may be extended to include the next phase after negotiation of mutually satisfactory terms.
- F. Services for each project including required completion dates for the various phases will be authorized by a separate purchase order, which establishes itemized services and fees therefore. In general, each project will be independent of other or previous projects and shall constitute a separate negotiated agreement. The City reserves the right to perform some of the work on any project and to specify the extent of work needed for each project.
- G. No assurance is given as to distribution of work required for the various design disciplines, and prospective consultants are alerted that substantial work by a single design discipline may be needed on a specific project, or there may be many projects requiring the services of a single or few design disciplines. Furthermore, there may be no work required at all in some of the design disciplines included in this RFP.
