<p><b>Summary of Program:</b> The mission of DMAB is "...to blend music, art, academic achievement, and civic engagement to inspire and enlighten children and teens in Jacksonville communities." Objectives to meet this mission include: (1) to provide tutoring and academic support thereby enhancing youth educational achievement and graduation rates; (2) to utilize the performing arts as a tool to facilitate youth development and to cultivate youth talent in the arts; (3) to conduct civic engagement projects and activities so that youth develop a connection to community and learn how to be responsible, productive citizens.</p> <p><b>Program Overall Status:</b> DMAB is currently serving 26 teens in the Woodstock, Brooklyn and surrounding Westside neighborhoods. We have an average of eight teens participating in our Homework Assistance Program daily. Five teens participated instrumental music programs. Eight teens participated in the All Star performance rehearsals and three teens participated in visual arts classes. DMAB continues to recruit teens in the Woodsrock and surrounding areas.</p>
