**Program Summary:**

LISC Jacksonville employs a strategy aimed at reducing crime havens in communities through non-police strategies such as physical revitalization, resident engagement and economic mobility initiatives. LISC Jacksonville works with community based organizations to help them in their work to revitalize neighborhoods. We supply training, funding and community building on their behalf. CDCs work with boards made up of community residents and business leaders and have grassroots knowledge of what the community wants and needs. Jax Journey funding allows LISC to leverage City of Jacksonville dollars with local and national funding for the betterment of our communities.

For 2016-2017, LISC Jacksonville's sub grantees are New Town Success Zone, Northeast Florida Community Action Agency, Northwest Jacksonville CDC, Operation New Hope and Springfield Preservation and Revitalization Council.
