<b>Program Strategy:</b> <i>To intervene with first time juvenile offenders of a violent crime, providing them alternative strategies to address conflict other than violence.</i>		
<p>Summary of Program: <i>Turning Point: Re-Thinking Violence (TPRV) is a six-week, court-ordered program, in accordance with the State Attorney's Office probationary criteria. Selected teens and their parents/guardians initially attend the Trauma Experience, followed by five weeks of group therapy sessions for the teens only. During the five-week group process, parents are court-ordered to also attend Week #3 and Week #6. The program incorporates a multidisciplinary format, inclusive of the Trauma Experience, the Victim Impact Panel, the Group Process, and Community Networking, thus engaging multiple community entities.</i></p> <p><b>Program Overall Status:</b> <i>On 07/31/2017, TPRV started our first (6) week track. We were only able to start with two youths; however, as the weeks progressed, one of the youth began to digress and stopped attending in the (4<sup>TH</sup>) week. The youth's mother advised that he was refusing to attend and when placed in the car, he jumped out and ran. Because of this refusal, he had to be dismissed from the class and the State Attorney's Office and the Department of Juvenile Justice were notified. We continued the track with the remaining juvenile who showed up every week on time and anxious to learn. He successfully completed all phases of TPRV and received his certificate of completion on 08/31/2017. Present for the youth's graduation ceremony was his mother, who has supported him from the inception of the first class. A copy of the graduation certificate was forwarded to the State Attorney's Office. Moving forward, the next class is scheduled to begin on 09/11/2017; thus far, Mr. Brooks has screened (5) youth with additional screenings on-going; youth, if accepted, will be added into SAMIS (ASAP). The Budget for SAMIS was finally submitted on 09/01/2017, with plans to submit for payroll reimbursements imminently.</i></p>
