Program Strategy: <i>To intervene with first time juvenile offenders of a violent crime, providing them alternative strategies to address conflict other than violence.</i>		
<p>Summary of Program: <i>Turning Point: Re-Thinking Violence (TPRV) is a six-week, court-ordered program, in accordance with the State Attorney's Office probationary criteria. Selected teens and their parents/guardians initially attend the Trauma Experience, followed by five weeks of group therapy sessions for the teens only. During the five-week group process, parents are court-ordered to also attend Week #3 and Week #6. The program incorporates a multidisciplinary format, inclusive of the Trauma Experience, the Victim Impact Panel, the Group Process, and Community Networking, thus engaging multiple community entities.</i></p> <p>Program Overall Status: <i>We hired our Program Coordinator on 6/5/17, and she is scheduled to attend SAMIS training. We developed a TPRV Brochure to be utilized by the juvenile justices, PD's, JPO's, and also prospective youth/parents, and we have been engaging in re-education efforts to bring TPRV back to the forefront for court sanctions. No youth have been served to date due to lack of court referrals; however, we anticipate referrals to begin flowing this month, and screenings for TPRV participants will follow immediately thereafter. The anticipated start date for our first TPRV track is 7/10/17. We also met with Gregory Pittman of Daniel Memorial to develop referral strategies linking TPRV with Daniel Memorial for wrap-around services post-TPRV graduation. Finally, we have agreed to participate in Judge Bass' Youth Services Fair, also to bring necessary attention to TPRV and to the work that the Journey is doing for area youth.</i></p>
