<b>Program Strategy:</b> <i>To intervene with first time juvenile offenders of a violent crime, providing them alternative strategies to address conflict other than violence.</i>		
<p>Summary of Program: <i>Turning Point: Re-Thinking Violence (TPRV) is a six-week, court-ordered program, in accordance with the State Attorney's Office probationary criteria. Selected teens and their parents/guardians initially attend the Trauma Experience, followed by five weeks of group therapy sessions for the teens only. During the five-week group process, parents are court-ordered to also attend Week #3 and Week #6. The program incorporates a multidisciplinary format, inclusive of the Trauma Experience, the Victim Impact Panel, the Group Process, and Community Networking, thus engaging multiple community entities.</i></p> <p><b>Program Overall Status:</b> <i>On 08/28/2017 the TPRV completed our first track. The program was scheduled to resume services on 09/11/2017, however due to Hurricane Irma we were not able to conduct this session. The next track did not start until 10/02/2017. Referrals have been exceedingly slow, and even when youth have been accepted to the program, many have no-showed for the first session which lowers our overall numbers as well. In an effort to increase the enrollment and inform stakeholders about the TPRV program., the TPRV staff participated in the Stakeholder's Provider Conference on 09/20/2017 held at the Duval County Courthouse, conducted by the Honorable Judge Suzanne Bass. Through attendance at this conference, we were able to disseminate pertinent information to key participants and we are anticipating an increase in referrals from the community. Additionally, Mr. Brooks is scheduled to attend the next monthly meeting of the DJJ to educate all JPO's about TPRV. We are working closely with Judge Bass as well to increase appropriate referrals directly from the Courts.</i></p>
