- c) Sound levels limited to 65 dBA during the night
- d) notification to be provided to sensitive receptors once the project scheduled has been established
 - a. to include estimated dates of concrete pours at least one week in advance
 - b. to include a phone number for project contact
 - c. separate notification for each subsequent building
- e) EQD is granted ability to require additional mitigation
- f) Monthly reports to JEPB staff during duration of the project
 - a. To include completion date of Building 1
 - b. Initiation of construction of Building 2

The motion was approved by the body.

Procedural Summary

Ms. Pollock, OGC, stated that the JEPB had just approved the variance request by Cooper Construction and that the order would be prepared and transmitted to same.

EPB Administrator James Richardson shared all required public notices appeared in the Daily Record. He then shared that a request for a noise variance was received from Southeast Utilities / Comcast seeking a variance for construction activities in the Downtown core. The

variance seeks approval for nighttime construction and increased sound levels allowed for all times. The request was reviewed by Air Committee at their November meeting where they asked that it be transmitted through the Steering Committee to the Board for approval. The conditions proposed included:

- o Allow for nighttime construction
- Sound levels limited to 90 dBA during the day and 80 dBA at night, with instantaneous peak of 105 dBA
- Sound measures to be conducted using "slow" method
- Measures for enforcement to be conducted at property line but no closer than 50 ft.
- Noise barriers and quieter equipment to be used within 300 feet of sensitive receptors – with roof on barriers to be used when receptor is 3 stories or higher
- EQD is granted ability to require additional mitigation
- 3-day notification to be provided to sensitive receptors which shall include a phone number for project contact
- Monthly reports to JEPB staff during duration of the project

Presentation by Petitioner

Mr. Jim Smith, with Fiber Corp, provided information regarding the above referenced project and the measures that they would take in order to mitigate noise from the construction activities. He indicated that during the EPB Air Committee they had agreed to additional items to help reduce the anticipated noise.

Staff Discussion of Petitioner Request and Staff Recommendation

Mr. Williams shared his review of the variance request application, questions that he posed to the applicant and concerns he continued to have with the suggested sound levels. He shared the modeling profiles that he had put together, as well as information he had obtained on various equipment and noise barriers. After review of that, in addition to what had been provided from the applicant, he was prepared to support the application request with a suggested sound level limit of 85 dBA during the day and 80 dBA during nighttime.

- c) Allow for nighttime construction
- d) Sound levels limited to 90 dBA during the day and 80 dBA at night, with instantaneous peak of 105 dBA
- e) Sound measures to be conducted using "slow" method
- f) Measures for enforcement to be conducted at property line but no closer than 50 ft.
- g) Noise barriers and quieter equipment to be used within 300 feet of sensitive receptors with roof on barriers to be used when receptor is 3 stories or higher
- h) EQD is granted ability to require additional mitigation
- i) 3-day notification to be provided to sensitive receptors which shall include a phone number for project contact
- j) Monthly reports to JEPB staff during duration of the project
 - a. Number of citizen complaints and any plan for remediation or corrective action in response to residents' complaints.
 - b. The number of exceedances of the acceptable dBA sound level and any remediation actions taken.
 - c. Project progress, including substantial changes
