The application seeks to rezone 0.16± acres of land from IL & RMD-A to RMD-A allow for two single-family homes. There is a companion Land Use Amendment from LI to MDR. The motion was seconded and approved by the CPAC members.
- T.R.U.E Commission: CPAC Member Velma Rounsville reported that the Taxation, Revenue, and Utilization of Expenditures "TRUE" Commission met on Thursday, May 5, 2022. CPAC Member Velma Rounsville informed the CPAC members that Kim Taylor, City Council Auditor, attended the meeting to address the commission's concerns and provided an overview of the meeting.
- Transportation: Vice-Chair Tyrona Clark-Murray reported that the North Florida Transportation
