- 1. Call to Order/Verify Quorum: Chair Pryor called the meeting to order at 5:33 p.m. Jessica Denson confirmed a quorum was present.
- 2. Approval of Previous Meeting's Summary: The October 2021 meeting summary was approved by the CPAC members.
- 3. Presentation: Anne Coglianese, Chief Resiliency Officer, City of Jacksonville, provided a brief overview of her career background and knowledge of the new Chief Resiliency Officer Position. Chief Resiliency Officer Coglianese informed the CPAC members that her focus for the next year will be developing a comprehensive resilience strategic plan for the City of Jacksonville.

5. Elected Official's Report:

- Darryl Willie, Duval County School Board Member, District 4, reported the following:
 - In September 2021, the Duval County Public Schools (DCPS) issued a mask mandate to help decrease the spread of COVID-19 and reduce the number of school closures. Effective November 1, 2021, parents will have an option to opt-out their children from wearing a mask, but Duval County Public Schools highly recommends that students wear a mask.
 - The Half-Penny Voluntary Surtax has generated a total of \$51.91 million in revenue (\$44.87 million for DCPS and \$7.04 million for Charter Schools). Rutledge H. Pearson Elementary School, 4346 Roanoke Blvd, will be the first DCPS to utilize the Half-Penny Voluntary Surtax. The project is scheduled for completion in 2023.
 - On Saturday, November 6, 2021, at 10 a.m., DCPS will be hosting a ribbon-cutting ceremony for the new John Love Early Learning Center, 1531 Winthrop Street.
 - Michelle Grover is the new principal at Andrew A Robinson Elementary, 101 West 12th Steet. CPAC members are encouraged to visit the school.
