

C&S WHOLESALE GROCERS COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT INITIATIVES IN JACKSONVILLE, FLORIDA IN 2018



C&S is in the food business and we're passionate about it. That passion inspires our vision for an America where every family has access to nutritious and fresh food. In partnership with Feeding America, our impact is both national and intensely local.

The issue we are most interested in addressing in our communities is HUNGER.

Feeding America

For many years, C&S has been a key donor to Feeding America, the nation's largest charitable hunger relief organization.

Feeding America's network of 200+ food banks and food-rescue organizations distributes more than 4 billion pounds of donated food and grocery products annually to Americans in need. Feeding America also supports 60,000 local charitable agencies, including food pantries, soup kitchens, emergency shelters, after-school programs and programs for senior citizens.

In **Jacksonville**, the Feeding America member food bank that C&S supports is the Feeding Northeast Florida.

Feeding Northeast Florida, Jacksonville

A grants in 2018 by C&S supported the food bank's "**SnackPack**" program which provides 3-5 pounds of nutritious food that is discreetly given to kids in need on Fridays to tide them over the weekend, or during holidays, when the school cafeterias are closed. The Duval County School System is partnering with Feeding Northeast Florida on this program.

The **C&S Jacksonville (and nearby Baldwin) facility** has, from January to November 2018, donated 457 tons of food to Feeding Northeast Florida to help feed neighbors in need.

To provide support for **summer meals programs** serving area children at-risk of hunger, C&S also donated 280 cases of paper products to Feeding Northeast Florida for the summer of 2018.

Share Our Strength/No Kid Hungry

Supported by C&S, Share Our Strength/No Kid Hungry is a national non-profit organization focused on ending childhood hunger in America. Through a network of community groups, activists and food programs, SOS/NKH targets children at risk of hunger and makes sure nutritious food is available where they live, learn and play.

Congressional Hunger Center

Located in Washington, DC, this national non-profit organization brings together the power of America’s lawmakers with the expertise and knowledge of leading hunger activists to develop innovative programs that deliver food to communities needing it most. C&S supports the Center’s Emerson Hunger Fellows, a domestic program.

FoodCorps

FoodCorps is a nationwide team of AmeriCorps leaders who connect kids to real food and help them grow up healthy. Serving alongside educators and community leaders, FoodCorps members partner with schools to put in place a three-ingredient recipe for healthy kids, creating a nourishing environment for all students.



United Way

Company-wide, C&S associates and the company are proud to invest in strengthening families and the places we call home through support to the United Way. C&S is honored to be one of 80+ Global Corporate Leaders for the United Way Worldwide.

C&S Jacksonville and Baldwin associates pledged \$13,093 to the United Way during the 2018-2019 workplace campaign in May '18. Together with the dollar-for-dollar corporate match, we are supporting local education, income and health services with United Way of Northeast Florida.

Our commitment to end childhood hunger is joined by an equal passion to increase educational opportunity for all children. We want to address the root causes of poverty -- and the combination of healthy minds and strong bodies ensure that children have a fair shot. In partnership with First Book, a national nonprofit organization, we donate brand-new, age appropriate books to children, schools and libraries in C&S communities across the country.

In 2018 to commemorate Martin Luther King Jr. Day of Service, a team of C&S employees went to the S.P. Livingston Head Start School in Jacksonville to read to 185 children and to give each two brand-new books.



C&S is constantly working toward minimizing its environmental footprint, including through a commitment to recycling. **Jacksonville associates focus on recycling** and their efforts keep cardboard, plastic and other items out of local landfills.
