

IV. PLEASE PROVIDE A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE STATUS OF THE PROJECT INCLUDING, WHERE APPLICABLE, AN OVERVIEW OF THE TYPE OF JOBS CREATED.

Project Omaha wa a plant consolidation to relocate the manufacturing of the life-saving apparel for the marine and aerospace industry customers such as US Military, US Coast Guard, Dept of Homeland Security as well as the commercial and recreational users. This apparel includes Anti-Gravity suites, Flight Deck Vests, Dry Suits, Flotation Vests, PFD's and a multi-layered aircrew ensemble.

This project move included the addition of more than 40 jobs including supervisory, engineering, skilled sewers, RF welders, quality, technical, management, buyer-planner and support positions.

This project began in early 2016 with the first equipment move in June 2016 and is now complete. We are still training associates on some of the advanced skill sets, but this does not hinder production. Project OMAHA is 100% integrated within the Jacksonville location.
