When installing a pool on owner "A's" property where the protective barrier (fence) would be right up against a neighbor's fence of similar height, the attached form may be completed by the owner "A" to eliminate the need for this second fence.

HOMEOWNER ENCLOSURE AFFIDAVIT

The purpose of this document is to make you aware of any limitations in the enclosure that is being permitted.

<u>Type</u> A: An enclosure with glass windows, insulated walls, with or without heat/air conditioning is considered an addition by the code. This type enclosure has certain structural requirements, requires footings and has certain electrical requirements.

<u>Type B</u>: A screen enclosure or an enclosure with vinyl windows, is not considered an addition, and has different structural and electrical requirements.

If you are installing a Type B enclosure, it <u>may</u> be difficult to later retrofit to Type A.
