York reported that homicides are down from seven to three, robberies to individuals are down from 37 to 24, car jacking's are up by one with a total of four, auto theft is up to 159, robberies to businesses are down by six, and aggravated battery is up to 150 so far this year. Lt. York also reported that the crime trend for the city is predominantly theft in beauty supply stores around town. Lt.
