# 2024 Jacksonville Neighborhood Awards Competition Application

The City of Jacksonville Neighborhoods Department is pleased to announce the opening of its 2024 Neighborhood Awards competition. Jacksonville's outstanding neighborhoods will be awarded and recognized in a ceremony on **Thursday, November 7, 2024**, for organized community activities and projects completed in the 2023 calendar year.

## **Neighborhood Award – General Description**

#### **PURPOSE**

The 2024 Neighborhood Award Program is designed to recognize the efforts of neighborhood and civic groups in Duval County. On November 7th, neighborhood groups will be awarded for activities that emphasize volunteer activities, leadership and collaborations that help their community with programs, events, artwork, or that physically and/or socially improve or beautify all of Jacksonville's neighborhoods.

If your organization began and completed a neighborhood project or activity between January and December 2023, you are invited to enter the 2024 Neighborhood Award competition provided the minimum application standards are met. These awards will highlight the tremendous efforts of Jacksonville community leaders that help to make the city a safe and clean place to live, work, play, shop, and visit.

Since all of Jacksonville's neighborhoods are spread out and have many different qualities, the judging criteria outlined on page 2 should be used to help you complete a successful application. There are countless ideas that are eligible for an award including programs for seniors or the children in your subdivision or apartment complex. Examples of project applications may include murals, park restorations, food pantries, community gardens and holiday festivals.

Please describe your project and/or activity using the criteria listed below (1-9). All applications will be reviewed and evaluated by a panel of judges. Your description will aid in the assessment of your submission.

# **Neighborhood Program Award Description - Categories and Judging Criteria**

- 1. Self Help/Financial Capability (0-20 pts) The extent of self-help is clear with minimal reliance on outside funding sources; the budget was well documented and realistic.
- 2. Grassroots Involvement (0-20 pts) The project/activity included significant neighborhood and/or business involvement and cooperation; diversity of participants.
- 3. Innovativeness (0-10 pts) The project/activity was a creative and unique way to address the neighborhood(s) issue.
- Community Benefit (0-10 pts) The project/activity helped the neighborhood as a whole and addressed a need; it improved the health, safety and/or appearance of the neighborhood.
- 5. Volunteerism (0-10 pts) The extent of volunteer contributions to the project.
- 6. Leadership Development (0-10 pts) The project/activity supplied opportunities for volunteers to take on leadership roles and develop new skills.
- 7. Partnership Building (0-10 pts) The project/activity created partnerships with public and/or private entities; and/or with other neighborhoods and community-based groups.
- 8. Sustainability (0-5 pts) The project/activity illustrated opportunities for self-sufficiency; project/activity included a minimal maintenance design and an ongoing maintenance plan.
- 9. Replicable (0-5 pts) The potential for the project/activity to be replicated in other neighborhoods.

# Neighborhood Award – Eligibility

An organization must have a <u>completed registration</u> in the Neighborhood Organizations Directory prior to submitting an application for the Neighborhood Award Program using the following link: <a href="https://jaxnhorg.coj.net/#/login">https://jaxnhorg.coj.net/#/login</a>. Once registration is completed, your application is eligible to apply for the 2024 Neighborhood Award Program. As stated previously, each Neighborhood Award application must represent a community group of neighbors or a civic group that has completed a project or activity that helped their neighborhood during the 2023 calendar year beginning on January 1, 2023, through December 31, 2023.

Neighborhood Awards are intended to acknowledge group work/activity amongst organized volunteer work. The intent is to celebrate community groups and neighborhood organizations that have not been compensated monetarily for the work, or most of the effort to complete the project or program shown in each application. For example, corporate or business companies that charge a fee for services or that are retail establishments, caretakers, paid companions, groundskeepers, interns, paid staff members or similar are not eligible for this award.

## **Neighborhood Award – Submission Steps continued.**

The following information <u>is required</u> to better understand and score your project/program application. Please answer the following questions using no more than five (5) double-sided  $8 \frac{1}{2} x$  11 white pages:

- 1. Attach a group photo of the program/project and its participants. (High resolution JPEG or PING 300 dpi or higher only). (Award finalists will be required to submit an electronic photo)
- 2. Describe your neighborhood and neighborhood organization and include the following information:
  - a. Briefly describe your neighborhood boundaries.
  - b. When was your neighborhood association formed? How many people live in your neighborhood? How many people participated in neighborhood meetings on a regular basis?
- 3. Provide details (a-c) about the nominated project or activity.
  - a. Describe your project/activity. Identify when it started, who initiated it and what you were trying to carry out.
  - b. What prompted your organization to develop this project/activity? Please describe circumstances and/or situations that made this a priority for your neighborhood residents.
  - c. List the six (6) critical steps/tasks your group took to develop/implement this project/activity?
- 4. Describe the role and level of involvement of neighborhood residents in each of the steps.
  - a. Why do you think this project was successful? Describe why it was beneficial, how it changed the neighborhood, and any unexpected benefits resulting from the project/activity.
  - b. If this project involved other partners, who was involved, what role did they play, and how critical were they to the success of the project/activity?
  - c. If this project/activity was going to be replicated by other neighborhoods, what four pieces of advice and/or lessons would you give to them?
- 5. Attach the following items:
  - a. A copy of the Required Cover Sheet and Application (page 3).
  - b. A budget showing income and expenses related to the project/activity including, but not limited to donations, grants, in-kind support and volunteer hours committed.
  - c. Up to six (6) additional items (photos, testimonials, etc.) you feel will help the judges have a better understanding of your project/activity.
- 6. Applications must be submitted using the following guidelines:
  - □ Hard copy submissions must be 12 point, on 8 ½ x 11 white paper, using Arial 12 font.
  - Electronic documents must be submitted in Word, or other word processing software.
  - Do not submit videos, DVDs, thumb drives or flash drives as part of your application.
  - □ Photos are encouraged (high resolution photos 300 DPI or greater)
  - DO NOT staple/bind or send bound applications of any kind. Binder clips are acceptable.

Failure to submit a complete application (Numbers 1-6) will limit the judge's ability to apply all criteria for award consideration.

### **NEIGHBORHOOD OF THE YEAR (NOTY) AWARD**

This year, the City of Jacksonville celebrates community leadership, innovation and initiative and will recognize the outstanding work of one neighborhood organization for their work toward improving the quality of life in their community. This recognition also includes efforts to support neighbors individually or as a group and in work that improves equity and access to resources throughout their neighborhood and city.

The panel of judges will decide the winner of the Neighborhood of the Year award from the finalists of all completed submission packets.

The Neighborhood Services Office is looking forward to seeing everyone on November 7th to celebrate and support all the award nominees. More information about the event will be available in the upcoming weeks. We look forward to seeing you in the fall!

#### **COMMUNITY EXCELLENCE AWARD**

The Community Excellence Award program recognizes the outstanding work of governmental entities, businesses, or corporations in Duval County who work to improve the quality of life in their communities and neighborhoods. If your organization completed a neighborhood improvement project or an engagement activity in 2023, please apply to enter the Community Excellence Award competition.

There are two categories for the Community Excellence Award:

- 1. Physical Revitalization/Beautification Programs that focus on physical aspects of improving the city by upgrading decorative aspects of the community, litter control projects, in a neighborhood or business district, or by creating a new green space, or similar projects are eligible. All projects in this category must be visible at the street level.
- Social Revitalization/Neighborliness Programs focusing on the social or cultural aspects of a neighborhood like safety, youth and/or senior programs, activities that make neighbors feel connected and foster neighbors working together on programs like an ice cream social, holiday celebration or festival.
