## How to check if a COA will be required?



### Instructions


#### Step 1:

Use the link above to be directed to one of the maps utilized by the City of Jacksonville




#### Step 2:

At the top of the screen, click "Layers"




#### Step 3:

Click the (+) button NEXT to "Historic". Do not click the box next to "Historic" as it will bring up all of the properties of the Historic Layer



**Step 4:**

Once the drop down opens after you click the (+) button next to Historic, you would click on the box next to “Historic Districts”. This will bring up the physical boundary of all three Historic Districts (Springfield, Riverside Avondale, and Saint Johns Quarter). Additionally, click on the box for landmarks as they are also regulated by the Historic Preservation Section.



**Step 5.**

From here, you would search for the address using the Real Estate (RE) number OR by simply typing in the address.

**Step 6.**

If your property is located within any of the areas of color (Green, Pink, or Blue) or a landmark (Dark Purple), then your property requires a COA application for any exterior changes. Regardless of its location on the property (rear, side, non-street visible locations).
