Applicants seeking to qualify for the In-Lieu Sidewalk Program shall complete an application before submitting the second 10-Set for review and consideration, if denied the first time based on a lack of sidewalks. Submittals for the 10-Set review will not receive final approvals until payment for the In-Lieu Sidewalk Program has been received by the Tax Collector Department.

Applicants completing Preliminary Site Development Plans and/or Planned Unit Development Applications shall submit the In-Lieu Sidewalk Program Application as part of these review submittals. All other applicants shall submit the In-Lieu Sidewalk Program Application directly to:

In-Lieu Sidewalk Program Application

The City of Jacksonville (COJ) is committed to applying the guidelines of complete streets per Resolution 2019-653. COJ requires that new development and redevelopment projects include adequate pedestrian access via the construction or reconstruction of sidewalk infrastructure. The goal of this policy is to ensure that all modes of transportation are taken into consideration when designing road improvements. Furthermore, it is ensuring that a complete sidewalk network is provided throughout the City, while also recognizing that sidewalks are not feasible in all circumstances due to unforeseen or uncontrollable situations.

Sidewalks shall be provided within all proposed development and redevelopment in accordance with the City's Land Development Procedures Manual. If the Developer is unable to construct sidewalks based on the criteria selected, upon City approval, a contribution to the In-Lieu Sidewalk Program shall be paid as a substitute to constructing a sidewalk. The failure to construct a sidewalk shall not cause or contribute to a safety hazard as determined by the City. Closing critical gaps in the sidewalk network and being the first to initiate development in an area or along a corridor are valid reasons to provide sidewalks and contribute to an effective countermeasure for the safety of pedestrians.

EXPLORE ALTERNATIVES FIRST: Prior to applying for the In-Lieu Sidewalk Program, alternative options of accommodating sidewalks shall be considered and documented including but not limited to:

REVIEW & ASSESSMENT:

Upon submission of an official Application, each request will be reviewed by the City Bicycle and Pedestrian Coordinator, Development Services, Right of Way and Stormwater Maintenance Division, and Traffic Engineering to assess compliance with the below criteria. The City Engineer shall review recommendations and comments prior to making a final determination. If the applicant qualifies, they will receive written notice approving their In-Lieu Sidewalk Program Application with payment amount. If the applicant does not qualify, a written explanation shall be provided. If a payment is requested, it must be submitted payable to the City of Jacksonville. Once the Tax Collector Department receives the payment, approval for 10-set will be completed. The review process can take up to 15-business-days.

PAYMENT CALCULATION:

Criteria for Qualification section specifies if a project is eligible for the In-Lieu sidewalk Program. The In-Lieu Sidewalk Program final amount will be calculate by square feet of property frontage (excluding driveway width). Applicants are to provide the total number of square feet being submitted to the In-Lieu Sidewalks Program, which will be confirmed as part of staff review. If approved, the official letter will have the final payable amount and the specific rate at which the applicant was set based on COJ development areas.

APPEALS: Applicants seeking to appeal decisions of the In-Lieu Sidewalk Fee request should follow instructions outlined in Section 654.137 (c), Ordinance Code.



In-Lieu Sidewalk Program Application

CRITERIA FOR QUALIFICATION:

In situations where the construction of a sidewalk is not feasible, select projects may qualify for the option of making an In-Lieu Sidewalk Program payment as an alternative to constructing a sidewalk. The In-Lieu Sidewalk Program payment is not to be used as an option to reduce project costs.

To qualify for the In-Lieu Sidewalk Program payment option a project must meet at least one of the following criteria (*check all that apply*):

- EXCEPTIONAL SPECIMEN TREE** - Requires the removal of or will adversely impact the health of a significant tree or an exceptional specimen tree as defined by Section 656.1203 (bb) (3), Ordinance Code - Hardwood tree with a Diameter Breast Height (DBH) of 24 inches or greater.
- ROW** - Contains significant right-of-way constraints. If a project is constrained by the ROW, it shall obtain an easement in order to install a sidewalk. The easement shall be obtained prior to applying for the In-Lieu Sidewalk Program.
- DRAINAGE** - Requires significant drainage modifications. A certain level of drainage improvements shall be expected when installing sidewalks. In accordance with the Land Development Procedures Manual, installing drainage pipe is considered the minimum standard of making required site improvements, where Section 2.2.5 states, "In some instances installing drainage pipe to replace a drainage ditch may be required and should be considered in the preliminary design. As such, installing drainage pipe to replace an existing drainage ditch does not qualify as a significant drainage modification."
- REGULATORY HARDSHIP** – A regulatory hardship means an official action issued, in writing, by a governmental agency that prevents the applicant from sidewalk installation requirements. Such official governmental action may include but is not limited to: a recommendation of denial of any permits or other required regulatory approvals such as building permits, environmental permits, administrative final orders, etc.
- CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM, DOWNTOWN COMMUNITY REDEVELOPMENT PLAN, JTA MOBILITY WORKS, OR BETTER JACKSONVILLE PLAN** - When Included as part of these documents, installing sidewalks may not be required when construction of sidewalks by the City or State is funded and provided in any of these two lists and when construction is scheduled to begin within two years.
- NO PEDESTRIAN ACCESS** - Building the sidewalk, in a non-residential area, would not improve or add to any existing or future pedestrian access. The most common instance of this is a non-residential development located directly adjacent to the end of a dead end street where building a sidewalk toward the dead end road does not provide pedestrian access to any building entrance, parking lot, or other activity area. In this case, sidewalk will not be required to be built between the dead end of the street and proposed development site.

ECONOMIC HARDSHIP:

Consistent with Section 654.137 (a), Ordinance Code, an In-Lieu Sidewalk Program Application may not be granted solely on the basis of economic hardship or if it would have the effect of nullifying the intent and purpose of these regulations.

If approved based on criterion #5 of the Criteria for Qualification, the developer has to post a sidewalk bond in case the sidewalk construction is canceled or delayed.

If sidewalk construction is canceled or delayed, the construction of the sidewalk is required and expected to start when the developer receives formal written communication by City Staff. After construction of the sidewalk, the bond will be returned following the guidelines of the COJ Planning and Development Services Department.

Rate = \$30.00 x (Development Area Sidewalk Width in Feet x Sidewalk Length in Linear Feet)

ASSESSED PAYMENT CALCULATION:

Below is the applicant's estimate total number of the linear feet of property frontage (excluding driveway width) where sidewalks are required as part of the proposed project. The In-Lieu Sidewalk Rate is equal to \$30.00 multiplied by the proposed linear feet (LF) times the minimum sidewalk width by development area. The estimated linear footage and sidewalk width will be confirmed as part of the staff review.
