Can you tell me more about this division?





- Consider options to encourage safe and efficient travel and reduce conflicts





JTA Launches Water Taxi **Pilot Program During Ferry Haul Out**



JACKSONVILLE TRANSPORTATION **AUTHORITY**



- Mayport Village & Fort George Island water taxi service will run on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays in April
- Pedestrians & bicyclists can use select St. Johns River Taxi passenger vessels to travel between Mayport and Fort George Island during the JTA Water Taxi pilot program
- The service will generally mimic JTA's weekend 30-minute Ferry service, with water taxi service available from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m.
- There will be no charge to customers to ride the water taxis during the final month of the haul-out
- Customers can catch the water taxi southbound from the Fort George Island Marina, located at 9954 Heckscher Drive, and northbound from the Mayport Boat Ramp located at 4870 Ocean Street
