


Bicycle Facilities near UNF




Existing Conditions

- Unbuffered bicycle lanes on Town Center Parkway
- Unbuffered bicycle lanes on Kernan Boulevard
- Proposed project is denoted in dashed blue line on map
- Project extends from UNF Drive to Kernan Boulevard
- Improves
 connectivity
 between these
 existing facilities



- Project has \$1,458,000 in funding allocated as of this past year
- Prior funding of \$276,587
- Currently have funding to take the designs from 30% to 100% and to complete construction of Phase I.
- Seeking TAP funding for Phases II and III



Design Details

- Shared-Use path on both sides of UNF drive to intersection of UNF Drive and Eco Road.
- Project extends southbound on UNF Drive to Alumni Drive and ends at Kernan Boulevard
- Protected intersections at Alumni Drive and Kernan Boulevard
- Proposed 10 foot shared-use path

- 3. Not expensive






Which would you rather walk across?






What if Your child was walking to school? You used a wheelchair? You were elderly?

Fewer Lanes Reduces All Crash Types



Not Expensive – most benefits from fewer lanes



What about traffic?

- 3 lane roads can carry 70%-110% of the traffic of 4 lane roads
- Each situation is unique
- Turn lanes help a lot



Under Capacity Roads with 4+ Lanes

- 38 under 20% capacity
- 103 under 50% capacity



Using Pedestrian and Bicycle Level of Stress in Practice



Level of Traffic Stress (LTS) is a practical and useful tool to assess the perceived comfort and safety of people walking or bicycling along a given roadway. Supporting efforts to develop safe and connected

networks of transportation facilities, an LTS analysis can identify streets that work well and areas in need of improvement. Moving beyond minimum design criteria, LTS helps planners, engineers, and advocates understand the interrelated factors that either encourage or discourage walking and bicycling.

This webinar will explore LTS history, data needs, methodology, and practical applications. The webinar will also cover a deeper dive into the latest guidance from the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) on how to calculate Level of Traffic Stress.


