



# CITY OF JACKSONVILLE AWARDED \$280K TO SUPPORT BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN SAFETY

The United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) announced in January that \$280,000 in federal discretionary grant funding would be awarded to the City of Jacksonville to support the development of its Vision Zero Action Plan. 510 projects were awarded funding nationwide as part of the Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) competitive grant program, which was established through the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL).

Development of the plan is the first step in reaching a target of zero traffic fatalities and serious injuries among all roadway users in Jacksonville by the year 2030. The plan will identify countermeasures for safer roadways, recommended policies and actionable items, a prioritized corridor network for targeted safety improvements, and short-and-long-term performance targets. The process of developing the plan will involve participation from all stakeholders, including elected officials, local, regional, and state governments, private sector, and nonprofit agencies, and – most importantly – Jacksonville residents.

# NEW TOOL TO IDENTIFY ISSUES AND HELP RESIDENTS "VENTURE OUT" SAFELY

The City's Transportation Planning Division, which focuses on long-range planning, transportation policy and project development, is undertaking a public outreach effort called Venture Out Jax 2025. The project website makes it easy for residents to flag transportation infrastructure and safety issues they may encounter in their day-to-day travel. The Interactive Mapping Tool allows Jaxons of all ages and abilities to leave feedback at specific locations where they believe issues should be highlighted for City staff, such as sidewalks that need repair, debris in auto or bike lanes, flooding concerns, or even identifying where new roadways should be constructed. Residents are invited to visit **VentureOutJax.com** to provide information about projects or issues they would like addressed by clicking "Map Your Concerns" and then adding the issue location to the map. A pop-up window will appear with specific information fields allowing residents to provide details and upload photos of the problems. ## ST. JOHNS RIVER FERRY CLOSURE: TEMPORARY SERVICE FOR BIKES AND PEDS

JTA is setting up a temporary water taxi service between Mayport and Fort George for the month of April while the St. Johns River Ferry is out of service for maintenance. The water taxi is too small for vehicles, but perfect for pedestrians and bicyclists. Best of all, JTA will not be charging fares for the water taxi (read: FREE!).



## **E 1ST STREET BIKE LANES**

As part of a resurfacing effort, both buffered and unbuffered bike lanes have been added to E 1st Street, between Main Street and Palmetto Street. The lanes are intended to reduce auto speeds while creating a designated area for cyclists to move more comfortably.

### FLORIDA BIKE MONTH S-LINE TRAIL BICYCLE RIDE

Florida Bike Month was properly kicked-off with a roundtrip S-Line Trail group bike ride beginning at the south trailhead near Myrtle Avenue Brewing, to the north trailhead at Norwood Plaza, and back. Local cyclists and staff from the toomany-sponsors-to-list used the bike ride as an opportunity to identify where improvements could be made to the trail, including adding amenities, implementing safer crossings, improvements to the overall alignment, beautification efforts such as murals and local artwork, and more. ### **BICYCLE REGISTRATION EVENT WITH JSO**

The Jacksonville Sheriff's Office partnered with COJ for two days of free bicycle registration on February 24-25 in James Weldon Johnson Park. Residents registered their property with unique serial codes and registration stickers to aid in tracking stolen items. Local bike shops, including Trek, ZenCog, and Champion Cycling, along with the North Florida Bike Club, and FDOT's Ped-Bike Resource Center, each hosted tables to provide bicycle information and to hand out free helmets, backpacks, t-shirts, and other safety-related giveaways.


