AMENDMENT #1 TO AGREEMENT FOR CITIZEN RECORD MANAGEMENT SOFTWARE SOLUTION

(City of Jacksonville Contract # 10036)

THIS AMENDMENT ("Amendment") is made and entered on September <u>30</u>, 2014, by and between the CITY OF JACKSONVILLE, a municipal corporation existing under the laws of the State of Florida, ("<u>City</u>) and QSCEND, INC. ("<u>OScend</u>").

WHEREAS, on July 31, 2014, the parties entered into a written agreement (the "Agreement") for City to obtain a Citizen Record Management Software Solution from QScend, which Agreement contemplated the need for software integration services ("Integration Services") and established the pricing therefore.

WHEREAS, the parties have now defined the City's need for Integration Services and desire to amend the Agreement to accordingly.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and of the mutual covenants herein, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Scope of Work.</u> QScend will provide the Integration Services, and City will pay for such services, in accordance with the 5-page Statement of Work attached hereto as Exhibit A. The parties agree that the term of the Agreement will, if necessary, be extended to allow for the completion of the Integration Services.
- 2. <u>Maximum Indebtedness</u>. The maximum indebtedness of City for all fees, reimbursable items and other costs for the Integration Services shall not exceed the sum of **One Hundred and Forty One Thousand and 00/100 Dollars \$141,000.00.** The total maximum indebtedness for all Services under the Agreement is now \$243,300.00.

3. Ownership of Works.

- (a) As used herein, the term "Work" shall mean each deliverable, drawing, design, specification, rendering, report, finding, recommendation, data and memorandum of every description, produced or delivered to City pursuant to this Amendment #1.
- (b) With the exception of QScend's pre-existing intellectual capital and third-party intellectual capital as described in Section 4 below, City shall own all right, title and interest, including ownership of copyright (limited to the extent permitted by the terms of any governing licenses), in and to each Work including, but not limited to software and source code, and derivative works relating to the foregoing. The use of these Works in any manner by City shall not support any claim by QScend for additional compensation.
- (c) Each Work, and any portion thereof, shall be a "work made for hire" for City pursuant to federal copyright laws. Any software, report, deliverable, or work product as used in connection with the Work, but previously developed by QScend specifically for other customers of QScend or for the purpose of providing substantially similar services to other QScend customers, generally shall not be considered "work made for hire", so long as the foregoing are not first conceived or reduced to practice as part of the Work. To the extent any of the Works are not deemed works made for hire by operation of law, QScend

hereby irrevocably assigns, transfers, and conveys to City, or its designee, without further consideration all of its right, title and interest in such Work, including all rights of patent, copyright, trade secret, trademark or other proprietary rights in such materials. Except as provided in the foregoing sentences, QScend acknowledges that City shall have the right to obtain and hold in its own name any intellectual property right in and to the Work. QScend agrees to execute any documents or take any other actions as may reasonably be necessary, or as City may reasonably request, to perfect or evidence City's ownership of the Work.

4. Intellectual Property.

- (a) QScend grants to City an irrevocable, perpetual, royalty free and fully paid-up right to use (and such right includes, without limitation, a right to copy, modify and create derivative works from the subject matter of the grant and the right to sublicense all, or any portion of, the foregoing rights to an affiliate or a third party who provides service to City) QScend's intellectual property (including, without limitation, all trade secrets, patents, copyright and know-how) that is contained or embedded in, required for the use of, that was used in the production of or is required for the reproduction, modification, maintenance, servicing, improvement or continued operation of any applicable unit of Work.
- (b) If the Work contains, has embedded in, or requires for the use of, any third party intellectual property, or if the third party intellectual property is required for the reproduction, modification, maintenance, servicing, improvement or continued operation of the Work, QScend shall secure for City an irrevocable, perpetual, royalty free and fully paid-up right to use all third party intellectual property. QScend shall secure such right at its expense and prior to incorporating any third party intellectual property (including, without limitation, all trade secrets, patents, copyright and knowhow) into any Work, and such right must include, without limitation, a right to copy, modify and create derivative works from the subject matter of the grant of the right and a right to sublicense all or any portion of the foregoing rights to an affiliate or a third party service provider. This subparagraph does not apply to standard office software (e.g., Microsoft Office).
- (c) Should City, or any third party obtaining such Work through City, use the Work or any part thereof for any purpose other than that which is specified in the Agreement (as amended), it shall be at City's and such third party's sole risk.
- 5. <u>Insurance.</u> Prior to performing the Integration Services, QScend shall provide evidence to the City that QScend has all customary and reasonable insurance coverages necessary to protect the City against claims and damages resulting from any acts, omissions and errors relating to the Integration Services.
- **6.** Entire Amendment. This Amendment, together with the Agreement, sets forth the entire understanding of the parties with respect to the matters addressed.



Executive Summary

This Statement of Work outlines the methodology QScend will utilize for the systems integration engagement with Jacksonville, FL ("Customer"), along with the scope of the project, a schedule of the project deliverables, if applicable, responsibilities for all parties, and the estimated fees for the project.

Summary of Project Approach

Our project approach is practical and requires customer input throughout the entire life cycle on priorities, scope, findings, recommendations and most of all clear expected deliverables.

Review of QScend Project Roles and Responsibilities

- QScend will provide qualified resources to deliver this project Keith LeBeau will be the Project Manager
 Travis Lent will be the Integration Development Manager
- QScend anticipates being on site at COJ 2-4 times in the process of this integration development implementation, each site visit should not exceed 2 days. These 2-4 site visits to COJ are inclusive
- QScend will provide professional and satisfactory completion of the stated work by February 1,
 2015 with the start date of October 1, 2014. Start date is critical to a satisfactory end date
- The QScend consultants do not charge for hours while traveling
- QScend will accurately and expediently report all charges and expenses incurred in the execution of this project

Review of Customer Project Responsibilities

The Customer will provide QScend with appropriate access to the network, facilities and personnel of the
organization, including remote access for deployment, testing, and support



- The Customer will provide cooperative access to knowledgeable staff that may be required during the integration process
- The Customer will provide accurate and current information about systems environments, business requirements, data, and third party software, as needed, to support the integration. If the information provided by the Customer is inaccurate or incomplete, and results in additional time expended above what the project budget calls for to deliver the task item, the hours beyond the budget will be considered outside the scope of the project and a Change Order will be required
- An upgrade timeline will be agreed upon prior to kickoff and QScend, subsequently, will allocate resources in
 order to successfully meet the project deadlines and control costs. The Customer is expected to meet project
 deadlines as well. If actions (or inactions) on the part of the Customer result in a project delay, and it becomes
 necessary for QScend to reschedule or reallocate resources, the cost of the project might escalate requiring a
 Change Order

The Customer will test the applications in the customer's environment to ensure they are familiar with bi-directional integrations.

The Customer will maintain responsibility for the following integration related tasks:

- Taking a back-up of test or production databases prior to integration
- Testing and troubleshooting firewall and folder permission rules to ensure application has necessary access

Engagement Scope

QScend will provide professional consulting and/or integration services to provide bi-directional integration to the Customers applications listed in the table below. This engagement will focus on the following activities.

Project Set-Up: Conference calls with QScend team and customer team members to finalize the integration specifications.

Application Exploration: Assistance from QScend reviewing and determining what configurations and functionality use would allow for the elimination of some other systems within the City. Assistance exploring new system features.

Interface Development - Design: Customer will provide documentation of requirements and technical specifications of inscope interfaces between QAlert and consuming interfaced applications.

Interface Development - Programming: Interface development will take place using QAlert published API or a data insertion into the transition SQL tables.

Software Acceptance: Customer personnel in partnership with QScend staff will execute acceptance testing of the interfaces. The functionality to be tested will follow the checklist developed during the discovery phase (and amended if modifications were added as part of Application Exploration).



Project Change

There will be 2 QScend resources on this project and we do not anticipate the need for any Change Orders. However, it may become necessary to amend the Statement of Work for reasons including, but not limited to, the following:

- · Discretionary changes to the project schedule.
- Changes in the scope of the project, including modifications to any one of the targeted interfacing applications.
- Non-availability of non-QScend products or services that are beyond QScend's control.
- · Environmental or architectural impediments not previously identified.
- Lack of access to customer personnel, data or facilities necessary to complete project.

If any of the above occurs the milestones may be delayed. In the event that it is necessary to change this Statement of Work a Change Order will be agreed upon by Customer and QScend.

Project Costs

QScend has estimated tasks required and the cost for hours necessary to deliver this project to be \$141,000 plus any reasonable and customary travel expenses incurred by QScend's consultant(s) associated with travel to the customer site. This is an estimate based upon QScend's current understanding of the project scope and past experience in executing these types of engagements. Total project hours and tasks required will be finalized with Customer during the Application Exploration phase. Unless otherwise determined during Application Exploration, the amount quoted is not to be exceeded although hours and subsequent billing by task may differ.
