WHEREAS: The Institute of Medicine has found that 100 million Americans live

with chronic pain as a result of serious illnesses and injuries; and

WHEREAS: Chronic pain costs the nation an estimated \$560 to \$630 billion

annually in medical expenses, lost wages and lost productivity; and

WHEREAS: Pain negatively impacts almost every aspect of a person's

life, including the ability to work, sleep and engage in social activities. Families and caregivers of pain sufferers are also

adversely affected; and

WHEREAS: The U.S. Pain Foundation's mission is to educate, connect, inform,

empower and advocate on behalf of its 80,000-plus members nationwide as well as all who live with chronic pain. The organization provides education on pain management skills and

constructive ways to cope with pain and find fulfillment in life; and

WHEREAS: Raising awareness about the effects of chronic pain results in

better outcomes, increased access to effective pain care, and

empowerment and validation for those living with pain.
