Backpack volunteers pack low-preparation, nutritious staples for children in Duval County and St. Johns County public schools. A \$100 donation feeds a child each weekend for an entire school year; and

WHEREAS: The City of Jacksonville supports all efforts to improve the health and

well-being of our children, ensuring they have every opportunity to be

successful in school and in life.
