

WHEREAS: Cancer does not discriminate based on age, gender, race or any other

characteristic. More than 10,000 American children under the age of 15

are newly diagnosed each year; and

WHEREAS: There are many different types of cancer and their causes remain largely

unknown; and

WHEREAS: Nearly 300 children in the Jacksonville community are currently

undergoing treatment for cancer, and another 130 local children will be

diagnosed this year; and

WHEREAS: Treatment for cancerous diseases is invasive, expensive and often

experimental, taking not only a physical toll on patients, but also causing

financial and emotional hardships for their families; and

WHEREAS: Local nonprofit Child Cancer Fund (CCF), Inc., was created in 1994 by a

group of parents whose children were battling the disease. It provides emotional, practical, educational and financial support for families on this journey, partnering with Nemours Children's Specialty Care and Wolfson

Children's Hospital to implement its programs and services; and

WHEREAS: CCF, in partnership with local radio station WOKV, hosts an annual

radiothon fundraiser at Nemours that has raised \$442,615 over the past

three years. The fourth annual event is July 20; and

WHEREAS: The City of Jacksonville recognizes and celebrates the many local

organizations and individuals dedicated to enhancing the quality of life for

children with cancer and their families.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LENNY CURRY, by virtue of the authority vested in me as mayor of Jacksonville, Florida, do hereby proclaim July 20, 2018 as

CARE-A-THON DAY FOR CHILDHOOD CANCER

in Jacksonville and encourage all citizens to join me in raising awareness of childhood cancer and the efforts being made in our community to support those fighting this unexpected battle.
