

WHEREAS: Winona Cargile Alexander, a founder of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority,

Inc., dedicated much of her life to serving others; and

WHEREAS: Although born in Georgia and educated at Howard University – the

birthplace of Delta Sigma Theta in 1913 - Ms. Alexander spent many

of her years in Jacksonville; and

WHEREAS: Upon her death in 1984 at the age of 91, she was buried in Evergreen

Cemetery, with no identification of her founding contributions to Delta Sigma Theta Sorority. On June 9, 2018 (during her birth month), members of the sorority's local Jacksonville Alumnae Chapter (formerly known as Alpha Iota Sigma) and national organization are gathering to unveil a gravesite marker identifying her role as one of its 22 founders;

and

WHEREAS: In addition to being the first custodian of the Alpha Chapter of Delta

Sigma Theta, Ms. Alexander's service to the Jacksonville community included time as a social worker for the Duval County Welfare Board, an admissions officer at Brewster Hospital, a board member of the YWCA and Methodist Hospital, and an elder at the Laura Street (now

Woodlawn) Presbyterian Church; and

WHEREAS: Ms. Alexander remained an active member of the sorority until shortly

before her death. Her legacy is upheld through a scholarship in her

name that is awarded to high school graduates; and

WHEREAS: For her decades of contributions to the Jacksonville community, the

City of Jacksonville is recognizing Winona Cargile Alexander's life and

service on June 9.
