

WHEREAS: Sexual Assault Awareness Month increases the awareness, dialogue and

understanding that sexual violence happens in every community; and

WHEREAS: Statistics show that nearly one in five women and one in 67 men in the

United States have experienced rape or attempted rape; and

WHEREAS: Child sexual abuse prevention must be a priority to confront the reality

that one in six boys and one in four girls will experience a sexual assault

before age 18; and

WHEREAS: Young people experience heightened rates of sexual violence; those

between the ages of 12 and 17 are 2.5 times more likely to be victims of rape or sexual assault. During their college years, one in five women

and one in 16 men are sexually assaulted; and

WHEREAS: Prevention is everyone's responsibility and all citizens play a role in

addressing behavior, promoting healthy attitudes and relationships, supporting survivors and assisting them in finding resources for

assistance; and

WHEREAS: Jacksonville recognizes the efforts of national, state, and local partners

dedicated to increased awareness and prevention of sexual assault.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LENNY CURRY, by virtue of the authority vested in me as mayor of Jacksonville, Florida, do hereby proclaim April 2019 as

SEXUAL ASSAULT AWARENESS MONTH
