

WHEREAS: Lupus is a chronic autoimmune disease in which the immune system

inexplicably and randomly attacks the body's own tissues and vital organs, including the kidneys, brain, heart, lungs, blood, skin, and

joints; and

WHEREAS: Lupus directly affects 1.5 million people in the United States with

thousands of new diagnoses every year, the majority of whom are young people and 90 percent are women. Lupus disproportionately affects women of color and is more prevalent in African Americans, Hispanics,

Native Americans, and Asians; and

WHEREAS: Lupus is one of the most difficult diseases to diagnose because its

intermittent symptoms may mimic those of other diseases, and no single test can definitively identify the illness. Yet, early diagnosis and treatment can lessen the progression and severity of the disease and

are vital to preserving patient health; and

WHEREAS: Awareness of lupus symptoms and health effects can contribute to early

diagnoses and the prevention of years of suffering. Increasing public awareness and focusing public attention on lupus and its devastating impact on patients' lives will provide hope for a better future for those

affected.
